First Reading Zep 2:3,3:12-13

A reading from the prophet Zephaniah Seek the Lord all you, the humble of the earth, who obey his commands.

Seek integrity, seek humility: you may perhaps find shelter on the day of the anger of the Lord. In your midst I will leave a humble and lowly people,

and those who are left in Israel will seek refuge in the name of the Lord.

They will do no wrong, will tell no lies; and the perjured tongue will no longer be found in their mouths.

But they will be able to graze and rest with no one to disturb them.

Integrity, Humility, Listening and Healing

This week I went to the Australia Day Ceremony in Ararat. I was conflicted because I think we should change the date. January 26 doesn't seem to be working well for us. But I wanted to see Chris Harris receive her award for volunteer work with the Ararat Eisteddfod. I support the eisteddfod because I think the arts are important and I think raising healthy girls is vital. Girls get dudded. When they dance they are amazing. And yes, boys dance too. I clapped and cheered madly when Chris' award was announced. The Ararat City Band was great, the Lions' breakfast was nice and the speeches were good. I came home and watched the news about the protests. There's more listening to do and more wounds to heal.

Linda Dessau, the Govenor of Victoria, said this: "we need to talk to each other in a way that heals rather than a way that wounds." She was quoting Barack Obama. I concur. We need to find ways that heal. Julia Gillard said, "If we accept the truth of our shared history, we can walk together in a spirit of healing." There's the healing again. Julia Gillard is the chair of Beyond Blue. Beyond Blue Support Service 1300 22 46 36. Anthony Albanese said we live in "the greatest country on earth." This piqued my interest because it's not great for lots of first nations people. I hoped he would acknowledge that. And he did. He followed up by plugging his Voice to Parliament proposal, an acknowledgement that there's room for improvement.

Then Taryn Brumfitt, Australian of the Year, was on telly. "We're facing a paediatric health emergency with rates of suicide, depression, eating disorders, anxiety and steroid use related to body dissatisfaction soaring ... This is not about encouraging obesity; this is not what I do. And this issue is not simply about weight or size, it's about the way that we feel about all of ourselves — our skin colour, our height, our age, our gender, our unique selves — and it's learning to move, nourish, respect and enjoy our bodies because you can't look after something you don't love." Jelena Dokic was shamed for her body while commentating at the tennis. Almost on cue this explained why we need the body image lady as Australian of the Year.

After all that, the bible gave us this Sunday's readings. Perfect. Zephaniah: "Seek integrity, seek humility." Matthew: "How happy are the poor in spirit." The poor in spirit are not those who are sad or poor, but those who make a priority of the needs of others." Maybe those who are good at listening and healing. They could have just read today's readings for Australia Day: Integrity, humility, listening to the other, healing. Fr Andrew

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

To follow Jesus does not mean merely that one travels with him from place to place. It means that one learns from him, that one follows his manner of life and his way of thinking. To follow Jesus means to follow his example in the way he respects himself and other people, in his use of the things of the natural world. It means that one listens to what he says, and asks for an explanation when what he says is not understood. All of this requires that the disciple be a learner, one who can learn from the life of Jesus as well as from his teaching.

The first lessons that the disciples must learn are found in the beatitudes. The same lessons are placed before us, the modern-day disciples. The setting of Jesus' teaching is so serene; a mountain apart, a teacher with his disciples gathered around him, simple statements that are coupled with glorious rewards. However, the reality of the lessons is in stark contrast with this tranquil scene. These beatitudes, these blessings call for profound inner transformation.

The gospel outlines the kind of person the disciple is to become; the psalm sketches the program to which the learner is called. The disciples of Jesus are not merely his followers; they also continue the work that he began. In whatever circumstance of life we find ourselves, as disciples of Jesus we work to sustain the good that is in the world and to transform whatever needs transformation.
