The GOOD Shepherd?

The John gospel writer's use of the image of Jesus as the good shepherd would have been a confronting image for the initial audience. Shepherds in first century Palestine were far from the idyllic pastoral image that we generally associate with the image. They occupied one of the lowest steps on the social ladder - men of such poor reputation that they could only be trusted to herd sheep; they certainly couldn't be trusted around other people! Jesus' use of the image cut two ways: it was a confronting image for the audience; but it was also a challenge to those leaders who had been charged to 'shepherd' their people and behaved no better than thieves - Jesus was giving them an image of what it means to be a good shepherd.

Focus on the Scripture

Reflecting on Jesus' discourse on the good shepherd, Pope Francis suggests we focus on three verbs: hear, know, and follow.

Firstly, we are called to 'hear the voice of the shepherd'. This, as the Pope points out, means being open to listening. Too often, the Pope says, 'we are overwhelmed by words and by the urgency to always have something to say or do.' We need to make time and space and effort for the good shepherd's voice to cut through our frenetic business and our own noisemaking.

Secondly, we are called to contemplate what it means to be known by the good shepherd. This knowing, the Pope points out, means more than knowing superficial facts about us like what we did yesterday. The sort of knowing Jesus speaks of is much more profound: God understands; He loves.

Thirdly, having heard the good shepherd's voice and accepting that we are known and loved, each one of us is called to follow the good shepherd. 'What do those who follow Christ do?', the Pope asks. 'They go where he goes, along the same path, in the

same direction.' This means seeking the lost, giving practical aid to those in need, and being compassionate to all.

Ultimately, we are called to allow ourselves to be shepherded. Sometimes this means being called out of our wayward tracks, at other times it might

mean moving on from familiar pastures. Either way, we are called individually, but not to travel alone. © Nick Brodie




From April 10th, Bishop Paul has appointed Fr Marcello Colasante to the parishes of Creswick, Daylesford and Wendouree forming a Ministry District across our three parishes and the five local Church and School communities of Creswick, Daylesford, Lexton, Waubra, Wendouree. I will work with Leonie Keynes in the Daylesford Parish Office and Maree Roache and Bernadette Prestwood in the Wendouree Parish Office as well as the Principals of our Catholic Schools - Michael Heenan (St Augustine's Creswick), Tim Hogan (St Peter's Daylesford), Leigh Bradshaw (Our Lady Help of Christian's Wendouree).

In the Diocese of Ballarat, a Ministry District is the term used in our pastoral planning document Looking Forward, to describe the sharing of resources between parishes, with the aim of working in collaboration to further the mission of Christ that has been entrusted to the Church. Our emphasis and focus is on mission, looking forward, outward, with the joy of the Gospel.

Pope Francis, in The Joy of the Gospel, dreams "of a 'missionary option', that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world rather than for her self-preservation" (#27). He recognises that we need to be in a "permanent state of mission" (25), going out, being alengaged in involving others and being constantly foways cused on reaching out. The vision of Pope Francis is an outward one and "mission" is at the centre of it. In this next chapter, our new Ministry district provides us all with an opportunity to exercise synodality, that is, walking together in faith, building a culture of encounter and accompaniment, discerning the way forward by genuine dialogue, listening to each other with prayerful openness to the Holy Spirit. I look forward to walking with you as a pilgrim in faith, together as servants of the Gospel, joyful missionary disciples.
