# FROM OUR ASSISTANT PRIEST

This weekend, Fr Matt is taking a short but well-earned break. So we welcome and thank Fr Peter Hudson for celebrating Saturday Vigil Mass in Mildura and Sunday Mass at Irymple and Red Cliffs.

This weekend's Gospel is one of the most significant scriptures in the Bible, because Jesus reveals the core of our Christian religion.

Many people mistakenly think Christian living is about following the commandments. This is an easy mistake to make, because following rules is at the heart of most religions. But Christianity is very different, and totally unique. In today's Gospel, Jesus makes an astonishing request: "Make your home in me, as I make mine in you."

The parable of the vine and the branches teaches us to draw life from Christ. But Jesus is not external to us. He is in us.

Nonetheless, he also respects our freedom. So how much authority do we give him? It's a bit like letting Jesus into our car. We can seat him in the back, or in the front passenger seat — or even in the boot! The most fruitful option is to invite Jesus into the driver's seat. Ask him to take the wheel.



Morning tea and light lunch will be provided.





#### FIRST READING

Acts 9:26-31

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

#### **RESPONSORIAL** Ps 21:26-28, 30-32, R. v.26

- (R) I will praise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people.
- My vows I will pay before those who fear him.
   The poor shall eat and shall have their fill.
   They shall praise the Lord, those who seek him.

- All the earth shall remember and return to the Lord, all families of the nations worship before him. They shall worship him, all the mighty of the earth; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust. (R)
- 3. And my soul shall live for him, my children serve him. They shall tell of the Lord to generations yet to come, declare his faithfulness to peoples yet unborn: 'These things the Lord has done.' (R)

#### SECOND READING 1 John 3:18-24

My children, our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active; only by this can we be certain that we are the children of the truth and be able to quieten our conscience in his presence, whatever accusations it may raise against us, because God is greater than our conscience and he knows everything. My dear people, if we cannot be condemned by our own conscience, we need not be afraid in God's presence, and whatever we ask him, we shall receive, because we keep his commandments and live the kind of life that he wants.

His commandments are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to. Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him. We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

#### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION John 15:4-5

Alleluia, alleluia!

Live in me and let me live in you, says the Lord; my branches bear much fruit.

Alleluia!

#### **GOSPEL**

John 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples:

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser.

Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me.

I am the vine, you are the branches.

Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing.

Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away – he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'
