STATE RENTS CLASSROOMS FROM CATH-OLIC SCHOOLS

As Victoria grapples with a surge of enrolments in the inner city and growth corridors, the Victorian School Building Authority is in talks with Catholic Education Melbourne about leasing the recently closed Mother of God School in Lyanhoe Fast.

It hopes state school students at the neighbouring Ivanhoe East Primary, which is nearing capacity, can move into classrooms at the empty site.

"It makes sense to consider using this vacant site next door to help accommodate more students," a government spokesman said.

A similar deal was struck for Camberwell Primary School a few years ago, and the school is now leasing the closed Our Ladies of Victories School, which it uses as a junior campus.

It is not known how much it costs to lease these sites.

As Victoria's student population hurtles towards one million students in 2020, schools are looking at innovative ways of accommodating the boom.

Some have rolled out three-storey portables while others are staggering lunch and recess to ease congestion in the playground.

Figures obtained by The Age show that state schools will be hit the hardest by the boom, with state schools' share of enrolments expected to rise from 63.7 per cent in 2018 to 64.7 per cent in 2022. Over the same period, non-government schools' share of enrolments is expected to decrease from 36.3 to 35.3 per cent.

Catholic Education Commission of Victoria chief Stephen Elder said that as the second largest provider of schooling in the state, his organisation was "happy to work with the state government over school sites and facilities".

The Mother of God school closed its doors last year due to dwindling enrolments, with the Catholic sector warning that the closure was a sign of things to come under the Gonski 2.0 funding model.

Some students displaced by the closure now attend lvanhoe East Primary. In a weird twist, they may soon end up studying back at their old school.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION:

The first way to reject the real Jesus is to domesticate him, and that is what members of his blood family were trying to do. They thought he was 'out of his mind', madly putting himself [and them] in harm's way and he had to be restrained.

Have you or I tried to domesticate Jesus Christ, to reduce him to a non-threatening Jesus-meek-and-mild? If so, we are closer to the family of Nazareth standing just outside his circle, ready to run for cover, than to the new family seated around him, really listening to him and therefore vulnerable.

The second way is to misconstrue all the evidence of Jesus' mission on earth and to claim that he must be in league with the devil, 'He has an unclean spirit'.

If you do this publicly, as did these religious leaders, then you have deliberately put God's plan for the salvation of others at risk, and it is this which is unforgivable. This is real blasphemy.

We might pause for a moment, implore the grace of God, determine to really hear the Gospels, discern the will of God for our lives, and so come back within the ultimate family allegiance of those who dare to call God 'our Father'.
