CHILD PROTECTION SUNDAY

'Stronger Communities, Safer Children'

The Australian Catholic Church's Child Protection Sunday again falls at the end of the national Child Protection Week campaign, stressing the importance of primary prevention to reduce child abuse and neglect in Australia.

So how do we, the Catholic Church, play <u>our part</u> in creating stronger communities where we work tighter to ensure our children are kept safe?

The images of child sexual abuse have continued to affect our entire community and diminish the trust some have place in our Church. That trust has been further eroded when the institution has failed to appropriately respond to the victim's needs.

Yet the Catholic Church is in unique position to offer much within this focus of creating stronger communities, safer Children. One such example can be seen in Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation Amoris Laetitia, in which families and consequently communities are encouraged through love, strengthened by the virtues of generosity, commitment, fidelity and patience to become stronger more capable and more resilient. Stronger families and Church communities can then help to keep our children safe.

As the Royal Commission's February 2017 "Catholic Wrap Up" approaches, Child Protection Week, and in particular Child Protection Sunday provides a wonderful opportunity to highlight the steps we have taken to make children safe through our communities; at home, in our churches, schools and Catholic agencies.

Gracious God you said let the children come to me.

The hurt felt by those wounded by abuse weighs heavily upon us. Often trust has been eroded when



institutions failed to appropriately respond to their

needs. Lord, we as your Church stand in need of your healing and help.

We ask you God to strengthen and guide all in our Catholic communities. Grant us wisdom in our time to make decisions that protect children and the vulnerable.

May our families and communities, through love, generosity, commitment and patience build stronger communities safe for children.

Let your grace and love fall gently upon our children giving them the inner strength, peace and resilience they will need for their life's journey.

We ask you God to help our Catholic communities to be resolute in building a community where our children both flourish and are safe. Amen



Arrived in Siena this morning. We will stay here an extra day and rest.



The journey through Tuscany has brought some challenging walks but most days have been quite lovely, with some beautiful views. There have been more Pilgrim Hostels as well as Monasteries to stay at. So that has been kinder on the pocket. Siena is a very medieval city, full of a great sense of Church history and presence. The Duomo is guite beautiful. There are guite a number of tourists around, so we will lay low for most of the time. I will be looking forward to catching up on some contact with the history and presence of St. Catherine of Siena of course. A pity she wasn't around our Australian Church over the past few decades. She'd have certainly challenged a few people in positions of authority when it came to dealing with recent issues. There have been more pilgrims along the way, especially since Lucca. We have not met any other Australians though. Most are very impressed to learn we have walked from Canterbury. We have about 17 days left ahead of us, planning to arrive in Rome about the 22nd of September. Hope all is well.

NEWS FROM ST JOSEPH'S COLLEGE

MILDURA'S CONNECTION TO MOTHER TERESA Very few of us can say that we have held the hand of a saint. But after the canonisation of Mother Teresa in Vatican City on Sunday, St Joseph's College Mildura teacher Denise Knight can say just that.

Mrs Knight was introduced to Mother Teresa when she was a teenager by her parents, who were actively involved with the Missionaries of Charity house in Fitzroy, Melbourne – the first house established by Mother Teresa in Australia.

She would accompany her parents there every Sunday to clean, make cups of tea, and talk to the homeless men who gathered there.

Mrs Knight's father also worked as a chauffeur, and whenever Mother Teresa came to Australia, he would drop everything to drive her and her sisters around the country to look for places to do more good work.

They came up through the Sunraysia region in the 1970s-80s, and have since established a Missionaries of Charity in Dareton.

Mrs Knight met Mother Teresa several times during her regular visits to Australia, and was even asked to join her order. "Mother Teresa asked me to become one of her nuns when I was 15, and again when I was 16," she said.

"It wasn't my calling, but she has definitely influenced the work I have done as a teacher, and inspired me to do what I can to help our community."



Mrs Knight said a photo of her father with Mother Teresa was always on display in her parents' home, and after they passed away, it was handed down to her. "I feel very blessed to have held the hand of a saint," she said. "It gives me hope to know there is a little bit of saintliness in us all."
