Sea Sunday

Today is Sea Sunday, when we pray for all those who live and work at sea. Even during a pandemic, seafarers continue to bring into our ports products that sustain our population and economy. The world may have come to a standstill but the ships have never stopped sailing from port to port delivering critical medical equipment and medicines to support the fight against the spread of the virus. Some 90% of the world trade is carried by ships or, more accurately, by the 1.7 million seafarers who work on the ships. It was estimated that in September 2020 some 400,000 seafarers who ought to have been repatriated were in fact stranded at sea because of COVID-19. In some cases, seafarers have not been able to go home for 18 months. The problems of isolation, loneliness, separation and anxiety about family and loved ones, have increased the physical and psychological stress on board ships, sometime with tragic consequences.
