

At last Tuesday's Meeting Tony Biviano presented the current results of our Stewardship Program Renewal:

Figures from our last Program 2011-2015:
Weekly average: \$3195
Number of pledges at the end of program: 286
We started the Program with 377 pledges
Average amount per pledge: \$8.47

Figures for our Renewed Program 2016-2018 to date:

Amount pledged per week: \$3782.

Number of pledges: 319.

New Givers: 33

Average amount per pledge: \$11.86

At the start of the 2012-2015 Program, 377 pledged. Over these 4 years, we had 23 givers die and 20 givers move from the Parish, and some who pledged didn't begin, making the 286 pledges. The pledges of those who died or moved away, and other people's circumstances changing, amounted to a loss of \$40,000 over the 4 years.

In this renewal Program some have chosen not to renew their pledges for various reasons, which is acceptable.

When Mass prayers were re-translated in 2011, there was discussion on whether the Eucharistic Prayer should include: "this is the chalice of my blood, ... poured out for you and for many ..." or should instead be worded: "poured out for you and for all ..." It was decided to go with the word "many" as the more accurate translation of what Jesus says in the Gospels, and the Prophets before him, such as Isaiah in our First Reading. In Semitic language, "the many" refers to others rather than oneself and carries the sense of being unlimited in number.

Pope Francis has announced a **Holy Jubilee Year of Mercy** to commence on December 8, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and conclude on Sunday, November 20, 2016, the Solemnity of Christ the King. 1st Reading: Revelation 7:2-4. 9-14

I, John, saw another angel rising where the sun rises, carrying the seal of the living God; he called in a powerful voice to the four angels whose duty was to devastate land and sea, 'Wait before you do any damage on land or at sea or to the trees, until we have put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of God.' Then I heard how many were sealed: a hundred and forty-four thousand, out of all the tribes of Israel. After that I saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. They shouted aloud, 'Victory to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels who were standing in a circle round the throne, surrounding the elders and the four animals, prostrated themselves before the throne, and touched the ground with their foreheads, worshipping God with these words, 'Amen. Praise and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and strength to our God for ever and ever. Amen.' One of the elders then spoke and asked me, 'Do you know who these people are, dressed in white robes, and where they have come from?' I answered him, 'You can tell me, my Lord.' Then he said, 'These are the people who have been

through the great persecution, and they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb.'

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 23:1-6 Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face.

The Lord's is the earth and its fullness, the world and all its peoples. It is he who set it on the seas: on the waters he made it firm.

Who shall climb the mountain of the Lord? Who shall stand in his holy place? The man with clean hands and pure heart, who desires not worthless things.

He shall receive blessings from the Lord? and reward from the God who saves him. Such are the men who seek him, seek the face of the God of Jacob.

Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face.

2nd Reading: 1 John 3:1-3

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are. Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us. My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not vet been revealed: all we know is, that when

it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is. Surely everyone who entertains this hope must purify himself, must try to be as pure as Christ.

Acclamation Matthew 11:28

Alleluia, alleluia! Come to me all you that labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest, says the Lord. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12

Seeing the crowds, Jesus went up the hill. There he sat down and was joined by his disciples. Then he began to speak. This is what he taught them: 'How happy are the poor in spirit: theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Happy the gentle: they shall have the earth for their heritage. Happy those who mourn: they shall be comforted. Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied. Happy the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them. Happy the pure in heart: they shall see God. Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God. Happy those who are persecuted in the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.'

_____ Gospel Reflection - All Saints Sister Veronica Lawson rsm.

This year's celebration of All Saints Day comes just one week after the Synod on the Family closes in Rome. We await the outcome of the Synod, recognising that there may not emerge the clarity of i direction we have come to expect from Synods of Bishops. Pope Francis speaks of a synod as an experience of "journeying together, laity, pastors and the Bishop of Rome." While he recognises that this may be "an easy concept to put into words", it is "not so leasy to put into practice." He reminds us that "a synodal Church is a Church of I listening...in which everyone has something to learn: the faithful, the College of Bishops, the Pope; each listening to the others; and all listening to the Holy Spirit". Readiness to listen demands humility and today's gospel

reading begins with blessings on the humble ("the poor in spirit" and "the meek"). We can thank Pope Francis for calling our Church leaders to a greater humility as they struggle to listen to the Spirit of God at work in family life. We have become so familiar with the beatitudes that there is a danger of our failing to attend to the extraordinary present and future reversal that they offer to those who suffer injustice at the hands of the not-so-humble. It seems a good time for us to listen anew to these words. God's favour rests on the humble, on the gentle, on those who grieve for the pain of the world, on serious justice seekers, on the mercyfilled, on the pure in heart, on peacemakers, and on those who suffer in the cause of right. We find here a description of so many of the faith-filled families who grace our assemblies with

their presence those who are alienated from the Church.


The repetition of "blessed are" echoes Israel's sacred songs and prophecies. God's favour or blessing comes in diverse forms: the hope of heaven; comfort in the face of grief; the earth for a heritage (a problematic concept); the experience of "being mercied"; face to face encounter with God; a great reward "in heaven". "Heaven" was a way of talking about God's empire of justice and compassion in contrast with the heartless empire of Rome and its modern equivalents. The greatest blessing of this feast is on those who mourn the plight of our planet the uneven access to Earth's precious resources and the resort to arms in the face of conflict. The families of our Church seek to be blessed in ways that set them free to transform our Church.

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

In his teaching Jesus said, 'Beware of the scribes who like to walk about in long robes, to be greeted obsequiously in the market squares, to take the front seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets; these are the men who swallow the property of widows, while making a show of lengthy

prayers. The more severe will be the sentence they receive.' He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the treasury, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has

put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she



possessed, all she had to live on.'
