#### Thoughts on the Gospel

If we could choose our own scripture texts each Sunday, chances are that we would choose comforting Texts about joy, love, peace and reward. We would probably be slow to choose more challenging or unsettling texts that are less user-friendly. Today's gospel reading, then, is a gift. "Do you suppose" Jesus asks, "that I am here to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division..." these are challenging words. No one can remain neutral. We must take a stand for or against Jesus. Whose side will we be on?

"It is important that one be assured of being on the right path, in some measure already possessing the treasure for which one hopes, being able to see.... through faith.... invisible realities. Faithful vigilance in the service of the Lord who has come and will come again can nevertheless lead to distressing situations and painful even tragic choices."

#### Reflection

A fierce fire in a eucalyptus forest bursts open the seed pods, cleanses the soil of smothering undergrowth, and returns nutrients to the soil to germinate the seeds. It is that sort of fire which Jesus brings to the earth.

So, at Pentecost, He sent His Holy Spirit '. . . like tongues of fire', bursting the early disciples out of the protective shell of the 'Upper Room', allowing them to be germinated as seeds of the early Church. It is the same in every generation which has to ask: What personal, family or social situations provide a hard casing which must be cracked open? What is the smothering undergrowth which prevents our germination as fearless disciples?

Jesus himself felt smothered by the small-minded people of Nazareth to which He never returned. He warns that families and good friends can try to smother the spark He wishes to ignite.

We might pause for a moment to pray that the fiery Holy Spirit might enable us to become a stand of tall trees reaching for the Risen Son in all His glory.
