Resilience, empathy, persistence and a "can do" attitude is a culture at St Joseph's that has amplified the creative performance of all during this pandemic time. We have seven class groups at school (125 students) and 480 students working from home. The program has been characterised by quality engagement from families, professional help from staff and the resilience, persistence and great heart of our students.

Importantly, our Sacramental preparation is continuing via home programs, supported by Fr John, video presentations and our teaching teams.

The bright and hopeful good news for our community is we have 81 students enrolled at Foundation (Prep) for 2021. Families engaged in this process via on-line tours, accessing video staff presentations and on-site interviews.

We ask our parishioners to continue to pray for us all in this pandemic time. We aim to stay positive, do our best and know we are "stronger together."
