GOSPEL REFLECTION

Last week, the wilderness was a character in the gospel reading. This week, we find a mountain and a cloud featuring significantly in the narrative. These other-thanhuman characters (wilderness, mountain, and cloud) and the prophets of old (Moses and Elijah) link Luke's



story of Jesus to the Israelites' covenant relationship with their God. Wilderness, mountain, and cloud also remind us that God's Earth is the locus of mystery: the place where human and other-than-human Earth beings are transformed through encounter with the divine.

For Jesus, the mountain is already a place of encounter with God, a place of prayer. Luke has Jesus spending a night in prayer on an unidentified mountain before he chooses the Twelve. Jesus now takes three of his closest friends (Peter, John, and James) up another unidentified mountain where the aspect of his face changes and his clothing becomes dazzling white. Elijah and Moses, the key prophetic figures of Israel, "appear" and enter into dialogue with Jesus, God's definitive prophet.

This episode seems to point to a time in Jesus' ministry when he accepts his likely fate: if he continues to challenge oppression and injustice, he is certain to encounter opposition, even death. He struggles with this realisation in the wilderness and comes to terms with what it involves on the mountain. The voice of God reaffirms the identity of Jesus and calls for a response: "Listen to him". These words are reminiscent of Moses' instruction to the Israelites: "Your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own people; you shall heed such a prophet" (Deut 18:15). For Luke, Jesus is the prophet-like -Moses whom they must heed. Peter wants to hold on to the experience of glory, to "make tents" and settle down. He prefers not to face the difficulties involved in fidelity to the mission. But that is not the way of discipleship. The tents evoke once more the Israelites' wanderings in the wilderness.

Like Jesus and his companions, we too need the occasional glimpse of glory. We also need the good sense to follow through on the path that brings life, despite the pain. We can feel overwhelmed by the enormity of the challenges facing us and by the opposition we sometimes experience. If we are to hear the prophet-like-Moses in our times, we have to come to terms with the personal costs involved. Some of us actually need to go alone or together to a mountain top or place of extraordinary beauty to discover again the strength that comes from encountering the divine. I once climbed within view of Everest. Every now and then, I climb Mt Buninyong. At such times, I know the wonder of God revealed in the beauty of the earth itself even as I sense its fragility and susceptibility to destruction.

ROYAL COMMISSION

The Royal Commission will hold a public hearing commencing Monday 22 February 2016 at the Ballarat Magistrates Court. It is scheduled to conclude on Friday 26 February.

The scope and purpose of the public hearing is to inquire into:

The response of the Catholic Diocese of Ballarat and other Catholic Church authorities in Ballarat to allegations of child sexual abuse against clergy or religious.

The response of the Congregation of the Christian Brothers in St Patrick's Province, Australia, to allegations of child sexual abuse against Christian Brothers.

Any related matters.

Probable structure of this Hearing:

It is expected that the Hearing will be structured along the following lines:

Opening address by Counsel Assisting the Commission, Gail Furness SC.

A number of new victims will give evidence.

Focusing on the 1970s and 1980s, an examination of how the Christian Brothers responded to disclosures and notifications of abuse.

Bishop Ronald Mulkearns will provide evidence via video link over several short sessions.

Former Church and Christian Brothers' administrators/ personnel will give evidence about known perpetrators, their offences and how they were dealt with at the time.

Schools where Christian Brothers were amongst the teaching staff in the 1970s and 80s may be mentioned in evidence.

Following the Ballarat Hearing

Cardinal George Pell will give evidence from 29 February 2016 by video link from Rome concerning Case Study 28: Catholic Church authorities in Ballarat and Case Study 35: Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne. The Royal Commission will sit in Sydney to hear this evidence. You can listen via the live streaming service.

Key Message

The key response of the Catholic Church community to this process is that survivors must be heard, the truth must emerge and that the Royal Commission will have the Church's full cooperation. We are all asked to keep victims, survivors and all those affected by the Royal Commission in our thoughts and prayers.

Signs of Hope in our Diocese

Some of the steps that are being taken in the Diocese of Ballarat to engage with and support victims and survivors of abuse and to move more hopefully towards the future are:

The Christian Brothers and the Diocese of Ballarat have commenced re-examining past claims and settlements in liaison with victims' and supporters' groups, CASA and other service providers.

Support is being provided for victims and survivors beyond financial settlements – counselling, psychiatric care, allied health services and consideration of future medical needs.

Victims are being encouraged to seek legal support so that any redress can come about through a sound and supported process. Bishop Paul Bird or Fr Justin Driscoll or a senior member of the Christian Brothers have been available to formally acknowledge and apologise to victims and survivors who seek this.

Eileen Rice (St Alipius' Primary School) and John Crowley (St Patrick's College) continue to meet fortnightly to build relationships with victims and survivors, to reconnect with past students and to invite contribution to innovative curriculum around protective behaviours.

Bishop Paul, Fr Justin and local schools have publically supported the Loud Fence movement.

CEOB's review of sexuality and relationships education curriculum is being undertaken in consultation with victims and survivors who have volunteered to support this project.

Considerations of redress for historic claims of abuse are being made ahead of any national scheme that may result from the Royal Commission's work.

Clear protocols have been established for dealing with perpetrators – including their ongoing supervision and the provision of a level of defence for perpetrators which is not injurious to victims.
