It noted that g this season Christians across six continents work to put into ice Pope Francis' encyclical on integral ecology, Laudato Si', and icipate in community events to deepen their love for Creator, ion, and each other". As we move into the second week of the Season eation, we might renew our commitment to the gospel call to reverence that constitutes our planetary home.

As we turn to the gospel reading for today, we are confronted by the involved in living a way of life that respects the rights of all created s. On the long journey from Galilee through Samaritan territory to the city rusalem, Jesus attracts a huge following and teaches relentlessly about ays of God. By the time he reaches Jerusalem, the crowds have thinned derably. Is this because it is too hard to persist with their initial impulse to the way of the gospel and the one who embodies its values? Implicit in ' teaching about carrying one's cross is a reminder of the intense pain acrifice involved in being a disciple. It sometimes means going against other family members want. It may even involve risking one's life for the of others. In the context of the Roman Empire, criminals who were nced to die by crucifixion carried to the place of their execution the cross on which they would hang. The cross image is thus shocking for ne. It is quite alienating for the faint hearted.

erm "hate" (misein) in this context seems harsh. The English translation to do justice, however, to the original Greek or to the Hebrew that lies this biblical notion. To "hate" in biblical terms is to "leave aside". ples are expected to love one another. There are times, however, when have to "leave aside" the wishes of those they love most for the sake of a el call to justice, compassion, and right relationship. If we are attentive to ender bias of this ancient text, we might note that married men are ssed while married women are not. Here as elsewhere, women have to read against the grain of the text in order to hear its message. Finally, there is a call in this gospel passage to "leave aside" unnecessary possessions. In a time of planetary vulnerability and of growing division between the privileged and the marginalised of the Earth community, the teaching of the Lukan Jesus has a particular resonance. There is no place in a gospel way of life for selfindulgence, for

EXCERPTS FROM POPE FRANCIS' RECENT MESSAGE FOR THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION

"And God saw that it was good" (*Gen* 1:25). God's gaze, at the beginning of the Bible, rests lovingly on his creation. From habitable land to life-giving waters, from fruit-bearing trees to animals that share our common home, everything is dear in the eyes of God, who offers creation to men and women as a precious gift to be preserved.

Tragically, the human response to this gift has been marked by sin, selfishness and a greedy desire to possess and exploit. Egoism and self-interest have turned creation, a place of encounter and sharing, into an arena of competition and conflict. In this way, the environment itself is endangered: something *good* in God's eyes has become something to be *exploited* in human hands...

In effect, we have forgotten who we are: creatures made in the image of God (cf. *Gen* 1:27) and called to dwell as brothers and sisters in a common home. We were created not to be tyrants, but to be at the heart of a network of life made up of millions of species lovingly joined together for us by our Creator. Now is the time to rediscover our vocation as children of God, brothers and sisters, and stewards of creation. Now is the time to repent, to be converted and to return to our roots. We are beloved creatures of God, who in his goodness calls us to love life and live it in communion with the rest of creation.

This is *the season for letting our prayer be inspired anew* by closeness to nature, which spontaneously leads us to give thanks to God the Creator. Saint Bonaventure, that eloquent witness to Franciscan wisdom, said that creation is the first "book" that God opens before our eyes, so that, marvelling at its order, its variety and its beauty, we can come to love and praise its Creator...

It is also *a season to reflect on our lifestyles*, and... our daily decisions about food, consumption, transportation, use of water, energy and many other material goods...

This too is *a season for undertaking prophetic actions*... Each Christian man and woman, every member of the human family, can act as a thin yet unique and indispensable thread in weaving a *network of life* that embraces everyone. May we feel challenged to assume, with prayer and commitment, our responsibility for the care of creation. May God, "the lover of life" (*Wis* 11:26), grant us the courage to do good without waiting for someone else to begin, or until it is too late.


