# SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY: AUGUST 28, 2022. SOCIAL JUSTICE STATEMENT 2022-2023 RESPECT: CONFRONTING VIOLENCE AND ABUSE

In their Social Justice Statement for 2022-2023, Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse, the Australian Bishops add their voice to global campaigns to confront and call out destructive attitudes and behaviours that lead to life-limiting and long-lasting impacts on many vulnerable members of our families, churches, and society.

The bishops invite us to investigate the scope, drivers, and enablers of abuse. They invite us to familiarise ourselves with programmes that promote the transformation of individuals and structures and to 'take responsibility for changing the cultural factors in our Church and society that have allowed violence against women and children to flourish.'

The voices of victims and survivors of violence and abuse are woven together with scripture, social research, and our rich Catholic social justice teachings. Catholic families, communities and organisations are encouraged to engage with the challenging material in the Social Justice Statement. We invite you to practice self-compassion and awareness of the needs of those in our midst who are struggling as the implications of the Statement flow from your prayerful and purposeful deliberations.

Sometimes our faith comforts and consoles us.

Sometimes our faith leads us into mystery and majesty.

Sometimes our faith invites us toward truth and transformation.

In the words of our new President of the Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference, Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB: We hope our message will help our whole community confront violence and abuse wherever they occur and become a community that fosters justice and respect for all.

God, in your goodness, you make a home for all; a home of safety where all may flourish. Place in us an attentive ear and humble heart as we commit ourselves and our community to promote relationships marked by respect and freedom.

We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.
