Share their journey urges Pope on refugee issue Published: 27 September 2017



Rohingya refugees walk into a camp in Bangladesh (Tommy Trenchard) Pope Francis will today launch a global campaign to promote the rights of refugees and migrants, Caritas Australia reports.

The Pope is encouraging people to talk with a refugee or migrant - to hear their story and share their journey. Francis is also speaking to governments about the issue.

"He is urging all nations to improve their role in the protection of the world's 22 million current refugees and to simplify their visa application processes," said Caritas Australia chief executive Paul O'Callaghan.

"He wants to see families re-unified wherever possible and to show a spirit of generosity and compassion to those who have lost so much," Mr O'Callaghan said.

On World Migrant Day 2016, Francis said: "Migrants are our brothers and sisters in search of a better life, far away from poverty, hunger, exploitation and the unjust distribution of the planet's resources which are meant to be equitably shared by all."

The Pope's call for change comes as the global Caritas network responds to 400,000 refugees who have fled violence in Rakhine state in Myanmar and crossed into neighbouring Bangladesh.

Cardinal Patrick D'Rozario CSC, Archbishop of Dhaka said: "Bangladesh has not only opened the borders, but we have also opened our hearts with love and compassion to the children, women, old, the sick, the wounded and even the thousands who are unborn."

The global Caritas confederation recently launched an Emergency Appeal to meet the needs of the newly-arrived Rohingyas in Bangladesh. Details: www.caritas.org.au/ sharejourney

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION:

In every life there is a struggle between obedience and disobedience, and this struggle takes various twists and turns. At times we are willing to conform to regulations set from the outside, and at times we are not. We are invited to choose in favour of the reign of God, or we are free to ignore the invitation. Those who are fundamentally righteous sometimes fall from grace, and people considered evil to the core sometimes reform their lives. What ultimately counts are not the promises made, but the actions taken.

We are called to discipleship, and there may well be urgency in this call, but it is an invitation that is to be accepted freely. As is the case with life itself, options are placed before us all the way along the road. We are invited to choose in favour of the reign of God, or we are free to ignore the invitation. However, the invitation always remains open to us, because God's desire for our acceptance is persistent and enduring.

The real choice set before us today is the imitation of Christ. The specific characteristic of Christ today is his humility. Since demanding one's rights can undermine the loving quality of community, Jesus' humility is offered for our imitation. It is very clear that whichever aspect of discipleship we examine, some aspect of community is also present. To be a disciple of Jesus is to follow him humbly as a member of a believing community.
