

Message from our Assistant Priest

This weekend we celebrate First Holy Communion! It's an occasion for all of us to recall our own First Communion — and also to focus on how we receive Holy Communion at every Mass.

After receiving, it's advisable to dedicate a few minutes thanking Jesus for his Real Presence in our body and soul. The Holy Spirit does not guide souls collectively, but inspires us personally, with unique resolutions, inspirations and affections. Still the central theme of our conversation after Holy Communion might include a consideration that Jesus is our friend, teacher, and *physician*.

Jesus insists that the worst sickness is hypocrisy: pride that leads us to hide our sins, even from ourselves. We must be totally sincere with him. We tell him the whole truth, and then we say: "Lord, you have cured so many souls; help me to receive you as the Divine Physician. These are my faults, but only say the word and I shall be healed."


Alleluia, alleluia! Shine on the world like bright stars; you are offering it the word of life. Alleluia!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

The Pharisees went away to work out between them how to trap Jesus in what he said. And they sent their disciples to him, together with the Herodians, to say, 'Master, we know that you are an honest man and teach the way of God in an honest way, and that you are not afraid of anyone, because a man's rank means nothing to you. Tell us your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.
