WIDER MASS ROTATIONS

As February emerges, and from 2021 having only two priests (not three) to cover our churches and faith communities across many towns (originally 4 parishes), there will be a greater number of LLAs and fewer opportunities for the celebration of Mass across our Pastoral Region. We will develop and trial a monthly rotation of Masses and LLAs, to seek as wide and equitable as possible a coverage - looking both at Sunday worship and weekday Masses. This will be based upon a monthly cycle of the 1st to 4th (and sometimes 5th) Sundays in a month. Added to this will be the opportunity for Mass celebrated in towns on weekdays, across the month. Of course there are many aspects of parish life to adapt and to develop as our new and larger area moves into the year. As disciples of the Risen Christ, we move forward in faith and seeking spiritual wisdom and commitment. First Reading: 1 Samuel 3:3 The body is not meant for -10, 19

Samuel was lying in the sanctuary of the Lord where the ark of God was, when the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He answered, 'Here I am.' Then he ran to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me'. Eli said, 'I did not call. Go back and lie down.' So he went and lay down. Once again the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eli and said. 'Here I am, since you called me.' He replied, 'I did not call you, my son; go back and lie down.' Samuel had as yet no knowledge of the Lord and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. Once again the Lord called, the third time. He got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli then understood that it was the Lord who was calling the boy, and he said to Samuel, 'Go and lie down, and if someone calls say, "Speak Lord, your servant is listening". So Samuel went and lay down in his place. The Lord then came and stood by, calling as he had done before, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel answered, 'Speak, Lord, your servant is listening.' Samuel grew up and the Lord was with him and let no word of his fall to the ground.

Alleluia, alleluia! We have found the Messiah: Jesus Christ, who brings us truth and grace. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 1:35-42 As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, 'What do you want?' They answered, 'Rabbi,'- which means Teacher - 'where do you live?' 'Come and see' he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour. One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' - which means the Christ - and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas' meaning Rock.
