Pope Renews prayers for people suffering horror of war ~ As he led his Wednesday General Audience, Pope Francis relaunched his appeal for peace in our war-torn world.

"We renew our prayerful closeness to the dear Ukrainian population so harshly tried and to those who suffer the horror of war in Palestine and Israel, as well as in other parts of the world," he said. The Pope also encouraged all people to pray for nations at war. "Let us pray for these people who are enduring war," he said, "and let us pray to the Lord that He may sow the seed of peace in the hearts of the authorities of the countries." The Israel-Hamas war in Gaza and Russia's war in Ukraine topped his list of situations that require global attention and concern. At the same time, he condemned the "enormous stock of available weapons" that offer the illusion of deterrence. "The contrary is true: the availability of weapons encourages their use and increases their production," said the Pope. "Weapons create mistrust and divert resources."

Pope at Angelus: Magi teach us to wonder at the humble Child Jesus. Pope Francis prayed the Angelus on Saturday, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, with pilgrims gathered in St. Peter's Square. The Pope invited the faithful to reflect on the scene of the Magi, who, after wondering about the apparition of a star, set out for Bethlehem to find Jesus and offer Him their gifts.

The three wise men, said the Pope, didn't find a prince or a nobleman, but a simple Child, the child of poor people, and recognized in Him the presence of God prostrating themselves before Him.

Their experience, he said, is important for us too, as "in the Child Jesus, we see God made man" and invites us to "wonder at His humility" like they did. "Contemplating Jesus, staying before Him, adoring Him in the Eucharist, remarked the Pope, "is not wasting time but giving meaning to time; it is rediscovering the course of life in the simplicity of a silence that nourishes the heart." ope Francis then invited Christians to listen to and learn from children "who also speak to us of Jesus, with their trust, their immediacy, their wonder, their healthy curiosity, their ability to cry and laugh spontaneously, and to dream."

"If we stand before the child Jesus and in the company of children," he said, "we will learn to be amazed, and we will start out simpler and better, like the Magi. And we will know how to have a new and creative outlook on the problems of the world." Pope Francis concluded by praying that Mary, Mother of God, may "increase our love for the Child Jesus and for all children, especially those burdened by war and injustice."

Pope at Angelus: Our Baptism made us children of God During his Sunday Angelus on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, Pope Francis reminds faithful that the day they were baptized, we became children of God forever, and this date of great grace must be remembered and celebrate Our Baptism, Pope Francis continued, has made us, in turn, "children of God." "It is, in fact, not, like John's, a symbolic gesture, but," the Pope explained, "a real gift of divine, eternal life, an event of grace and communion with God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit." At our Baptism, we are immersed in "His infinite embrace, transmitting to us the power of His saving love." "Let us also thank Him," the Pope continued, "for the parents who brought us to the font, for those who administered the Sacrament to us, for the godfather and godmother, for the community in which we received Him." "Am I aware of the immense gift I carry in me because of Baptism? Do I recognize, in my life, the light of God's presence, who sees me as His beloved son, as His beloved daughter?" "May Mary, temple of the Spirit," the Pope prayed, "help us to celebrate and welcome the wonders the Lord performs in us." Pope Francis concluded by asking the Blessed Mother to guide our paths.
