You might put this note about my illness: Dear fellow-parishioners, You'll notice my name on the sick list. Since about the beginning of December, my legs & especially my feet have been enlarged by fluid being retained. The exact cause has not yet been diagnosed. A couple of weeks back, I stood to close to a car door when I was shutting it. I ripped some skin from my calf in the process. This is the second time I have done this (Who makes the same mistake twice?)

As you know, within the elderly, cuts in the legs don't heal quickly; and won't heal at all while the leg is swollen with fluid. A doctor and a nurse at Ontario Medical are overseeing my treatment. I have to take a couple of fluid tablets each morning, which causes a problem when I have morning Mass or other duties. In addition, I have to lie down for about 90 minutes each afternoon. All of this, of course, cuts into my working day.
