6th Sunday of Easter / Year B 5th & 6th May 2018

The constitutions of my religious institute remind me that "the tender mercy of our God has given us one another". The implications of this profoundly beautiful truth are spelt out thus: "In our communities, we try to live in the friendship of Christ's disciples [Jn 15:15]. To so live calls forth relationships of equality, a real acceptance of ourselves and others, a forgetfulness of anything that does not make love its message." Living in the friendship of Christ's disciples is at the heart of a gospel way of living. It is the commission at the heart of today's reading and seems to be exactly what Pope Francis wants to say to all believers in his new Apostolic Exhortation, Gaudete et Exultate (Rejoice and be Glad).

As we listen to the proclamation of the gospel, we might attend to the repetition of "joy", the three-fold repetition of "friends" and the nine-fold repetition of "love". We might attend to the way in which the pronouns I/my/ me and you/your function in the passage. We may also notice the reference to "commands" and "commandments".

We tend not to associate "commands" with friendship and love because those we count as our friends are not usually in the habit of commanding or ordering us to do what they want. We derive little joy from being told what to do. And yet, there is no resiling from the juxtaposition of these terms. God, imaged in the gospel passage as "Father", loves Jesus. Jesus remains or abides in God's love so deeply that this love flows on to his friends. They are to love one another as Jesus has loved them. This is his commandment or commission to them, and by extension to us. It directs them/us to live for each other and put their lives/our lives on the line for one another. It means being faithful to the teaching of Jesus as he has been faithful to God's commandments.

Remaining in the love of God or of Jesus and doing what God or Jesus commands seem to be one and the same thing. In other words, love is not just an emotion: it is always expressed in action that is in tune with and for

the sake of the other. The disciples need no further explanation. Jesus' whole life and his courage in the face of impending death have shown them what it means to love one another.

Living in the friendship of Christ's disciples is not some abstract goal. Too often we affirm the goodness of our selfless companions on the journey only when we come to lay them to rest. As we approach the end of the Easter season, we might give thanks for the love of our friends, for their witness to holiness and for the joy that they bring

REDEMPTORISTS MISSIONARIES

Fr. Redempt Jawa CSsR



l am from Indonesia. I was born on 8th December 1981. On the 14th July 2011, I had my priesthood ordination in Indonesia and right after that I was sent to the Redemp torist mission in Auckland, NZ. Last month, I was appointed to Redemptorist formation house in Kew, Melbourne as Prefect of Student to journey with our young Redemptorists who are preparing to be future missionaris.

Rev. Deacon Xuan Hieu Nguyen CSsR

My name is Xuan Hieu NGUYEN, and my baptismal name is Joseph, but I like to be called Hieu. My family lives in North of Vietnam where my parents are farmers. am the middle child of two brothers and two sisters. My family worked hard in the field of rice. All income is dependent on the harvest of rice. Therefore, our lives would be harder when storm destroyed all rice so that it really affected my family. My brothers and my sisters could not go to school; they offered to help my family by

finding other jobs so that they could earn money to support my family However, my parents still gave me a chance to go to school if I could find different ways to support my study. I entered the Redemptorist Congregation in Hanoi where I was a postulant for six years. I went to Saigon in 2005 and after my novitiate I was professed a Redemptorist on the 27th of June 2007. I studied a further two years of Philosophy in the major seminary. In 2011, I was asked to come to Australia to further pursue my theological studies in English and I graduated three years ago with a Bachelor of Theology from Yarra Theological Union (YTU) in Melbourne. I became a deacon on Saturday 30 September, 2017. I felt so happy. I went to mission in China for 3 months and 1 month in Singapore. Please pray for me as I also pray for you so that I would become a genuine witness for Jesus Christ to bring Good News to everyone, especially for the poor people and those who are abundant in society. "Becoming a gift for everyone".

MERBEIN MOSAICS PROJECT

The first Mosaic work dates have been set for Wednesday May 02, and Tuesday May 08, 10am- 4.00pm at LMW old FMIT Workshop on Etiwanda Ave just over 14th Street —up from the Salvation Army Complex. The focus is the Merbein Centenary and it is hoped that many Merbein and Merbein connected people will be involved in this continuing successful project. Even an hour or two would be great and you don't need prior 'mosaic' experience or artistic ability. It is great fun and very social. If you plan to stay all day you will need to take your own lunch.

CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME: How often do we stop to think about where the paper we use comes from? In Laudato Si', Pope Francis refers specifically to our use of paper, citing it as an example of a problem linked to our "throwaway culture". He writes, "Most of the paper we produce is thrown away and not recycled ...We have not yet managed to adopt a circular model of production capable of preserving resources for present and future generations, while limiting as much as possible the use of non-renewable resources, moderating their consumption, maximizing their efficient use, reusing and recycling them" (Laudato Si'#22).

Pope Francis is right to be concerned. In 2007-2008 'Clean Up Australia' reported that we used 4,250,000 tonnes of paper and of that we sent 1.9 million tonnes to landfill. Trees are the main resource in paper production. A single tonne of paper consumes approximately 20 full grown trees while recycling 1 tonne of paper saves 13 trees. Here's one point to ponder: 15% of deforestation is due to toilet paper alone.

SCHOOL NEWS

On the evening of the 15th of May, OLSH is holding a Cyber Safety Information Session in the Multipurpose Room. Kevin Cummins from the Ballarat CEO will be presenting the session, and also working with staff the previous day. The session focuses on living with the ever increasing amount of technology in our children's lives and how to deal with tricky situations around technology use. We strongly encourage all parents, and particularly the parents of our senior students, to attend.
