Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen





Christmas Day Inspiration: Queen Elizabeth II hailed inspirational unsung heroes in her Christmas Day broadcast to the Commonwealth. She put the focus on 'ordinary people doing extraordinary things', urging people to achieve 'small things with great love'. "I often draw strength from meeting ordinary people doing extraordinary things; volunteers, carers, community organizers and good neighbours; unsung heroes whose quiet dedication makes them special. They are an inspiration to those who know them, and their lives frequently embody a truth expressed by Mother Teresa. She once said: 'not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love'. On our own, we cannot end wars or wipe out injustice, but the cumulative impact of thousands of small acts of goodness can be bigger than we can imagine.
