Are you able to freely make the commitment to the Holy One of God? **Marriage Tip:** Teach your children the importance of the Eucharist. 'Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clearer expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord, as also the connection between the Eucharistic banquet and the eschatological banquet in the Kingdom of the Father' (General Instruction of the Roman Missal 281). During the celebration of the Mass, we both offer and share the Sacrifice of Christ and renew the Covenant given us by Christ. Both the Sacrifice and Covenant are separately expressed in the rituals of Bread and Wine. We bring our gifts to be consecrated at the Mass and shared in Communion in the broken Bread. As we drink from the Chalice we renew our commitment to the Covenant of Christ. By eating and drinking we proclaim fully and clearly the Mystery of Faith. 'See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.' (Entrance Antiphon)
