Preparing for the 2020 Plenary Council

Prior to the 2020 Plenary Council of the Australian Catholic Church, 2018 and 2019 will be preparatory years in the Diocese of Ballarat. The Diocesan Pastoral Council is planning to support gatherings at parish and regional level throughout these years. Bishop Paul has announced a Diocesan Mission to prepare spiritually for the Plenary Council. This Mission will be held across the Diocese in 2018, April 23rd-May 7th, which is during the Easter Season, invoking the Holy Spirit. Twelve Redemptorists will be available to the Diocese, with four in each three zones. Fr Glen de Cruz CSsR will coordinate the involvement of the Redemptorists in this 2018 spiritual preparation for the 2020 Plenary Council.

Dear Colleagues,

The Australian Bishops have identified the liturgical year of 2018 as a

national Year of Youth, which invites the Church into dialogue about the importance and life-giving presence of young people in the Church and society. It calls for dialogue and active engagement focused on the reconnection and renewal of a new generation of young people in the life of the Church. In Catholic education, this provides an opportunity for us to focus our energy anew on our ministry to students, many of our parents and younger staff members.

At World Youth Day 2016, Pope Francis called young people and the Church to 'open new horizons for spreading joy'. As we set out on the journey of the 2018 school year, we are all challenged to consider how we can: ...take the path of the "craziness" of our God, who teaches us to encounter him in the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the sick, the friend in trouble, the prisoner, the refugee and the migrant, and our neighbours who feel abandoned. To take the path of our God, who encourages us to be politicians, thinkers, social activists.

Perhaps seeking God in the lives and witness and yearnings of the young people with whom we work - whether students, young staff or young families - is a good starting point. So often, a small unexpected **interaction** might be the ideal opportunity to share the Good News and to accompany young people as they discern the paths to which God calls them.

The prayer for the Year of Youth, invites the "Holy Spirit of this Great Southland" to "inspire our entire faith community, as we prayerfully discern new horizons for spreading joy in the lives and communities of the People of God." May the year ahead in Catholic education across the Diocese of Ballarat enliven our education community and inspire us to be courageous as together we "build a civilisation of love".
