Making Connections: Preform an act of service each day this week. Pray the prayer of St Ignatius Loyola: Lord Jesus teach me to be generous, to serve you as you deserve to be served, to give without counting the cost, to fight without heeding the wounds, to work without seeking rest, to spend my life without expecting any other return than the knowledge that I do vour will.

Did You Know? Points of Interest and Catholic lore: Acts 12:2 reports the martyrdom of James. He was killed, probably by decapitation, by Herod Agrippa, grandson of Herod the Great. during a persecution of the early Church.

Exploring the Word: Christianity is not a state where power and authority is lorded over others. Instead it is a call to service and humility and may come at great cost. It is often in serving others that we learn something about ourselves or experience a renewed sense of purpose. Have you experienced this?

Sharing the Tradition: Today's second reading reflects on the priesthood of Christ but Christians understand that: Christ...has made of the Church 'a kingdom, priests for his God and Father'. The whole community of believers is, as such, priestly. The faithful exercise their baptismal priesthood through their participation, each according to his own vocation, in Christ's mission as priest, prophet and king (CCC§1546). Today is Mission Sunday. You could explore the vocation of missionaries and the role of all the faithful in 'mission'.

Symbols & Images: The 'cup' and the 'baptism' to which Jesus refers are his suffering and death on the cross. These images evoke for us the sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist by which the death and resurrection of Jesus are kept at the heart of our faith and our worship. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

Living the Word: Pray for the ordained clergy. Pray for vocations to the ordained clergy. Pray for each other that you will be able to partake of the priesthood of Christ conferred on your baptism.

Daily Prayer: Maker and author of life, in Jesus we have found the path to wisdom. Let us, therefore, be bold to approach you, not seeking privilege but asking mercy. Let us live among one another, not seeking to be served but to serve.

Marriage Tip: Hold hands. It may sound corny but try holding hands when discussing something sensitive. It physically reminds you that you may disagree about something, but that you're still

connected and committed to each other. Vocational View: Life's rewards are tied up in the spirit of service. Just as the Son of Man came to give His life, so too are we then called through our profession of faith to serve others. Lord, we pray, 'let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in You, to do your will.'




