FIRST EUCHARIST—WEEK FOUR

In the last session we reflected on the ways in which Jesus is present when we celebrate Mass. In this session we are reminded that at the end of Mass we are sent out "to love and serve the Lord". As fully initiated Christians we are called into action: we are sent out to follow the example of Jesus AIMS:

- 1. To reflect with the children on how Jesus calls his disciples to a life of love and service.
- 2. To help the children appreciate that one of the demands of sharing the Eucharist is the call to serve others in love.
 - To enable the children to identify ways in which they can love God and love one another.
