Collection for Sick and Retired Priests—next weekend

Creating a secure retirement future for the priests of the diocese is a duty and care in which we can all participate. Eighteen retired priests are currently supported by this Fund. Some live privately, some are retired in units in Ballarat or elsewhere, others live in supported accommodation.

The funding required for these commitments is ongoing. Along with the priests' own contribution of approximately \$40,000 per year, this annual collection has allowed the Fund to continue to support our sick and retired clergy.

A credit card facility is available for your convenience, and contributions over \$2.00 are tax-deductable.

Spring

In conjunction with the Orthodox Church, Pope Francis has declared 1 September as "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation." In the southern hemisphere this is the first day of Spring. We celebrate Spring as gift, given in love, and to be cared for in love.

Spring marks the turn of the season even though Winter may still be in evidence. As the season progresses, the morning sky will brighten earlier, birds will shrill in the care for their newborn, new seedlings will sprout, and gardens will bloom with a range of colours. O God, we celebrate these changes secure in your promise of ever-renewing life as fixed in the rhythms of creation. Praise be to our Creator God!

Clothing is an indicator of personality, of social status and belonging (ask any adolescent!), and a reflection of the wearer's culture—in other words, it can be a metaphor for identity. At **baptism** we were clothed with a white garment as a sign of **our new personhood in Christ**, and the prayer of the rite acknowledges this garment as an outward sign of the Christian dignity that has been bestowed through the sacrament. The prayer continues with the hope that, with the help of family and friends, **that baptismal dignity** will be carried unstained by sin into the everlasting life of heaven. We all grow out of the material garment, but the continuing challenge is to **grow into** what it symbolizes: the **new** self created in God's love and holy truth for the new age and the new creation. Such a radical **transformation** is our possibility. - Sr. V Holyhead sgs.(Sowing the Seed)

"As we have experienced **communion** in this celebration, we are sent forth to work to strengthen the **bonds of communion** between the people with whom we live and work. As a Eucharistic people, we Catholic Christians are a people with a mission." I find the descriptor "Eucharistic people" very powerful. It implies that, **along with Jesus**, we have the capacity and the potential to nourish and sustain others. After all, that's what Jesus does for us, each time we partake of the Body and Blood (ie share in the Eucharist). But I also like the notion of "being sent forth", of being "people with a mission". With Jesus inside us, we can bring the message of Good News and hope to those suffering or living in despair. - David McGovern
