Making Connections: What have you 'left behind' to follow Christ? Let go of something

John lived in the town of Capernaum on the northern sore of the Sea of Galilee.

Exploring the Word: This week we return to the Gospel of Mark which will be the main source of readings through the weeks of Ordinary Time this year. Mark's Gospel was the first of the accounts of Jesus' ministry to be written down. It is widely accepted that it was written about 65-70AD for a community in Rome where Christians were undergoing persecution because of their faith. Because of this setting. Mark often recalls stories which give great hope to people and encourage them to stay firm in their faith in the face of opposition. In this gospel, the disciples do not make excuses or delay. They simply leave everything to follow Jesus. They are immediately drawn to the words and person of Jesus; nothing else is as important as the Kingdom of God and the One who preaches it. The disciples undergo conversion and take up a whole new way of life. What are the signs of conversion in vourself?

Sharing the Tradition: The first disciples to be called by Jesus offer us a model of how we are expected to be followers of Christ. A disciple is one who takes another as teacher and model. As disciples, we must not only believe in the teachings of Jesus but allow them to influence how we live our lives. We are called to 'profess our faith, bear witness to it and spread it'

Living the Word: Images associated with boats and fishing are common in Christianity. The Church is often represented as a boat carrying all in it across stormy seas. Just as the nets of the fishermen of Galilee were flung wide to catch many fish, the Church is open to all; none are excluded from the invitation to the Kingdom.

Marriage Tip: The early years of marriage require adjustments and compromises. "My way is the right way" will only lock you into fights. Make sure it's not always you or your spouse yielding to the will of the other.

Daily Prayer: The time is fulfilled, O God, your kingdom comes near and Christ bids us follow and join in your work of compassion. Let this call move our hearts and kindle our spirits, so that, leaving

Mystery Of Faith

When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.

And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you." MARK 1:11 As we come into a church, we dip our fingers in the Holy water font and bless ourselves. We do it by habit, often without reflecting on what we are doing. When I was growing up, it was not unusual for Catholic families to place a little Holy water font in the bedroom. Do you ever connect any of this with your Baptism?

The Holy water font is really a mini-baptismal font. We take the Holy water to remind us that, at our Baptism, we were initiated as a disciple of Jesus Christ, receiving the saving benefit of what Jesus did for the whole world on Calvary. Our Baptism was the first day of our individual salvation. Even though John the Baptist felt uneasy baptising Jesus, the Baptism of Jesus was his public inauguration for his mission, defining him as God's Son, the Beloved, who enjoyed the Lord's favour. People are often defined by what official position they have in the community (eg, Prime Minister), or defined from history (eg, Alexander the Great, William the Conqueror, John the Baptist). So too, Jesus Christ, the "anointed one", received his office at his Baptism. This throws light on our own Baptism which defines us publicly in our relationship with God and with one another in the Church community. So, we pray "Our" Father, not "My" Father. We are defined as a child of God, adopted into God's family and sharing God's mission. Our Baptism enrols us in the public office of being a Catholic Christian. Think of this next time you take Holy water entering the church.

Our Heavenly Father, as you adopted children reborn of water and the Holy Spirit, may we be **always conscious of our public office** as Catholic Christians sharing your mission. Amen.
