RELIGIOUS FREEDOM PETITION: Our Federal Government has promised to enact a new Religious Freedom Bill in line with other Laws designed to protect people and outlaw discrimination. While the exact wording of this is yet to be formulated, Senator Concetta Fierravanti-Wells is circulating a petition in favour of both protection against religious discrimination and protections for all people of faith. Copies of this petition are in our parish churches this weekend and we are invited to read and sign this for tabling in the Australian Senate.

PLENARY COUNCIL INFORMATION: After 17,500 submissions reflecting the views of over 222,000 people have been assessed, reflected upon and prayed about, six National Themes for Discernment have emerged. These invite us, as People of God, to consider how we are called to be a Christ centred Church in Australia that is: 1. Missionary and Evangelising; 2. Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal; 3. Prayerful and Eucharistic; 4. Humble, Healing and Merciful; 5. A Joyful, Hope-Filled and Servant Community; 6. Open to conversion, Renewal and Reform. We are asked to pray and reflect upon these topics as thematic working papers on these are drawn up for us to consider.

PRAYERS FOR GWEN O'CONNOR: Our well known former parish priest, Fr Pat Flanagan, asks for our prayers for his sister, Gwen O'Connor of Port Macquarie, who has aggressive gall bladder cancer and is expected to be in her final weeks of this life. Below is from the Sunraysia Catholic Communities parish bulletin: "MY PORT MACQUARIE SISTER, GWEN O'CONNOR:

Each year since 1983, I have spent a good part of my holidays with Gwen who is now 88 and has an inoperable cancer on her gall bladder. This is likely to be my last holidays with her. I'll fly North on Monday, August 5. I'll be back for the first weekend in October. PJF"

DEACON BONIFACE PERDJERT RIP: We join with our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander brothers and sisters in farewelling their beloved deacon earlier this year. Boniface was ordained the first permanent deacon in Australia in 1974. He walked between two worlds – Catholic and Traditional – and also brought these together. On this weekend that we listen to the story of Abraham and Sarah in our First Reading, its appropriate to reflect on the words of Boniface: "My people existed here in Australia thousands of years before Abraham. In all that time God was working with my people. He worked through their culture. He was saving us despite our human weakness. He was preparing us for the day when we would see the features of Aboriginals in the image of his Son." Deacon Boniface was at his side when at Alice Springs in 1986 Pope John Paul II said to Aboriginal people: "You are part of Australia and Australia is part of you. And the Church herself in Australia will not be fully the Church that Jesus wants her to be until you have made your contribution to her life and until that contribution has been joyfully received by others."
