Making Connections: All the readings for this week speak of foreigners who have accepted faith in the one God. The gospel tells of a great learning moment for Jesus. He ignores the pleas of the gentile woman but ultimately, she forces him to recognise that salvation is available to all people who have faith. This would have been a salient message for those in Matthew's community who struggled to come to terms with gentiles entering their community.

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. Israel despised the Canaanites. It loathed the Canaanite religion with its pagan gods and fertility cults and found many of their practices abominable.

Marriage Tip: What has been a low point in your relationship with your beloved? How did you get through it? If you're still in a desert, ask for help – from your spouse, God, or from a counsellor (no shame in that).

Daily Prayer: Let people of every race, language and way of life find our assembly to be a house of prayer for all peoples, where foreigners are welcomed as friends, where strangers are called sisters and brothers.

A Vocation View: It's so easy to push people out of our lives. But the Lord knows no boundaries or races or colours. Spread the Good News that we are all God's people.

Eucharist—Session 2 Remembering Jesus

In the last session we reflected on how we gather at Mass to celebrate. We now consider how this "special meal" helps us to remember and give thanks. Like a family meal, the Mass is a time when we gather to share, to talk, to listen and to be nourished: we do this in the presence of Jesus and we learn what is means to follow him.

ATMS:

- To help the children become aware that a celebration can recall a past event and make the past present.
- To help the children see the Eucharist as a meal they share in memory of Jesus.

How to defeat the proposed euthanasia bill (circulated by Diocesan Office) Some Points: ⇒ The Victorian Government should be

- spending its time tackling important issues like law and order, not pursuing radical social policies like euthanasia.
- Euthanasia turns doctors into life takers and patients into victims. It completely distorts the patient/doctor relationship and undermines the essential trust at the heart of the relationship.
- ⇒ The Government used to stand for protecting society's most vulnerable, but now they are putting their very lives at risk.
