3 April 2016—Second Sunday of Easter

There is a delightful vignette recounted by the liturgical artist Gertrude Mueller which tells of a Hungarian custom performed during the Easter Octave. On Easter Monday the boys of the Hungarian villages went from house to house, and wherever young girls lived, they came up to the door, recited a blessing and then splashed the girls with water. The girls in turn invited them in and everyone feasted on Easter specialties, and the girls gave the boys some of there carefully painted eggs to take home. On Easter Tuesday they replayed the whole game in reverse.

I like this story, not just because of its folksy charm, but because it reminds us that the celebration of Easter is not all over after Easter Sunday, but carries on during the week of Easter (the Easter Octave) and beyond for the 50 days of the Easter Season. The other thing I like about the story is the underlying baptismal motif in the splashing of the water. Easter celebrates the resurrection of Christ, and it is through baptismal waters

that we enter into and share in the

risen life of Christ.

Baptism is described as the portal, a gateway that leads into the sacramental life of the church. Through this sacrament of life Christ is present to us by the power of the Holy Spirit. To experience the presence of Christ is to experience his peace. In today's gospel Jesus thrice repeats the phrase: "Peace be with you". Through our encounter with Christ, especially in the sacrament of the Eucharist, we become the peace of Christ in our world.
