WE ARE A CHILD SAFE PARISH: Since the introduction of "Towards Healing" in our diocese in 1996, "Integrity in Ministry' for clergy and religious in 2004 and "Integrity in the Service of the Church" for all lay employees and volunteers in 2011, our Parish and Diocese have been endeavouring to better acknowledge and respond to past wrongs and inadequacies and ensure best possible care and protection for all whom we serve especially those who are young. The recent Victorian Government Parliamentary Inquiry into the Handling of Child Abuse by Religious and Other Organisations and Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse made many recommendations challenging us to continue to strive for the best interests of both children and adults so that we live each day the love of God we proclaim for each and every person. In 2013 Bishop Paul Bird established the Diocesan Professional Standards Consultative Panel to enhance the capacity of our Diocese to safeguard children and vulnerable people. Guided by all of the above, complying with legislation and implementing initiatives of our own, below are some of the Child Safe measures taken by our Parish:

- Making Child Safety an agenda item at every Parish Council meeting.
- Appointing Jill Morse our Child Safety officer to coordinate and oversee child safe standards in our Parish and be a separate-from-clergy contact person for advice, support and reporting.
- Regular contact with Michael Myers, Coordinator of Professional Standards in our Diocese.
- Child Safe training courses regularly attended and done online by Parish clergy and secretary.
- Implementing a Working with Children Register with current WCC card status for all clergy and parishioners, including our Sacrament Team, who have particular contact with children.
- Creating a Volunteers Register in which are recorded the names and contact details of all parishioners who are on Cleaning, Flowers, Reading, Eucharistic Ministers etc. rosters.
- Changing all St Augustine's Church and Hall locks in February 2019 and recording in our Parish Key Register the names of all who have been issued with new keys.
- Placing a glass panel in the Reconciliation room door in St Augustine's church to enable all penitents to be clearly visible from outside during the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- For children's Reconciliation and our pre-Easter Parish Reconciliation, Confessions are heard in prominent public spaces at front and back of St Augustine's church.
- Purchased 68 Burke St. house for our parish office and clergy residence to be separate buildings rather than having offices and living quarters under the same roof.
- Being one of 11 Parishes in our Diocese (and our Diocese the first in Australia) audited for Child Safety in May 2019 by the newly created Catholic Professional Standards Limited.
- Putting a copy of our Parish Child Safety Policy / Commitment to Child Safety on our Parish website.
- Displaying copies of "Integrity in the Service of the Church" and our Diocesan "Code of Conduct for Caring for Children" at the back of each church in our Parish.
- Preparation to transfer St Augustine's school governance from parish priest to new diocesan body.
