8 March—Feast Day of St John of God

On 8 March, we celebrate the feast day of St John of God. Starting with a small porch in the city of Granada, where John brought those who were sick, poor or in any kind of need, he went on to set up shelters and eventually a hospital. Before he began his first hospital he went to work with the Jeremites, a religious order who also looked after the sick and there he received training in medicine and nursing skills. News of John's work spread far and wide. He began to attract others who wanted to help him look after those in need. John died on 8 March 1550, aged 55. He was canonized in 1690 by Pope Alexander VIII. A few years after his death those who were his followers were recognised as a religious order and were called the Hospitaller Brothers of St John of God. Today, the work which John began in a porch in Granada continues in 52 countries in the world and covers a wide range of care for those with physical and learning disabilities, the homeless and poor, those with mental health problems and the elderly. There are many similarities between John of God and Venerable Nano Nagle, and this may be why she was inspired to take the name in religious life of Mother Mary St John of God.

International Women's Day

The origins of International Women's Day can be traced back to labour movements that emerged at the turn of the twentieth century in North America and Europe. In 1910, Clara Zetkin, the leader of the Women's Office of Germany's Social Democratic Party tabled the idea of an International Women's Day at the second International Conference of Working Women in Copenhagen. The proposal received unanimous support, and the first International Women's Day was held the following year on 19 March. In 1913, International Women's Day was moved to 8 March and has been held on this day ever since. Australia's first International Women's Day was held in 1928 in Sydney and the next year the event was celebrated in Brisbane. In 1931, annual marches were launched in both Sydney and Melbourne and both marches continue to be held today. International Women's Day is an occasion to review how far women have come in their struggle for equality, peace and development. It is also and opportunity to unite, network and mobilise for meaningful change. Each year, UN Women National Committee Australia hosts some of the largest International Women's Day events around the country to celebrate global achievements and discuss actions needed to continue accelerating gender equality.
