FR DENIS DENNEHY RIP: 12/6/1944 to 15/10/2021

A native of Artigallivan near Killarney in Ireland, Denis' seminary education was at All Hallows College where he was ordained on 16th June 1968. Encouraged to serve in the Ballarat diocese by his cousin Fr Mick Keogh, Denis was the last of the very many Irish priests who came to serve here from when this was established in 1874. He was appointed assistant at Ararat parish and then Swan Hill. In 1975 he became our diocesan priest working in Aitape PNG where he was free to express his immense creativity as a liturgist and really blossomed. He told me he quickly found that only action episodes really touched the natives so he built his liturgies of the Word around episodes including many of Jesus' parables. He was loved by his people so much that they once gave him their highest honour of dressing him as a chieftain. In early 1981 his PNG appointment concluded and he came to Maryborough as my assistant for 6 months. He was a great gift to our parish especially our youth. After a sabbatical back in Ireland, Denis was appointed to replace Gerry Ridsdale at Mortlake in 1982. It was a pretty terrible time for Denis who had to do a lot of listening and accepting of vicarious punishment. After Mortlake, Denis became pp of Charlton in January 1987 where the parish church burned down that a previous PP had under-insured. Under Denis they got a new church that has proved over the years to be a very good church. Then he had a short stint helping out in Colac till in January 1998 appointed pp of Camperdown. His eleven years there ended with contracting pneumonia that hastened early retirement. He then worked for a time in a remote aboriginal parish in Broome diocese till returning to Ireland on holiday where he suffered a stroke and spent nine years in Our Lady of Lourdes Nursing Home near Killarney then his final months at Kenmare Nursing Home till contracting COVID-19 and entering eternal life on October 15.
