Making Connections: Keep the light of Christ consciously before you. We proclaim your death O Lord, and profess your resurrection until you come again.

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. The Easter Triduum (which means 'three days'), lasting from Holy Thursday evening to Easter Sunday evening, is the climax of the Church's year. Holy Thursday is sometimes known as Maundy Thursday, a corruption of the Latin word for commandment, mandatum. This is to commemorate the 'new commandment' that Jesus gave his followers at the Last Supper: Love one another as I have loved you.

The stories of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus were the earliest stories told and later recorded by the early Church. The commemoration of the events of the Triduum is the earliest of Church celebrations when the first Christians gathered to break bread together.

Good Friday and Easter Saturday are the only days of the year on which Mass is not celebrated.

The women come to the tomb to anoint the body of Jesus early Sunday morning because it is the first chance they have had to do so. The Jewish Sabbath begins at sunset on Friday and ends at sunset on Saturday. During this time no 'work' can be done so the women must wait until dawn on the first day of the week.

**Exploring the Word:** The death and resurrection of Jesus is **the fundamental pattern of life** for the Christian.


**Living the Word:** The cross and the paschal candle are the central symbols of these three days. Death is conquered in new life. The darkness of the tomb is conquered by the light of Christ. Much of this symbolism is present in the baptism ceremony of the Easter Vigil.

**Sharing the Tradition:** The neophytes now enter the period of mystagogy or post-baptismal catechesis. This is a time for community and the neophytes together to grow in deepening their grasp of the paschal mystery and in making it a part of their lives through meditation on the gospel, sharing in the Eucharist, and doing the works of charity. (Rite §234)

**Marriage Tip:** Is there anything for which you need to ask your spouse's forgiveness? Ask your spouse, and encourage him or her to do the same.

**Daily Prayer:** As we hear the word that brings salvation, make our hearts burn within us. In the breaking of the bread, open our eyes to recognise the One whose feast it is. Through the presence of every friend and stranger, reveal to us the face of the one who had first to suffer but who has entered now into glory: your Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, our Passover and our Peace.

**A Vocation View:** Christ has become our Paschal Sacrifice. **Your ultimate purpose**, to live and to breathe, **is the eternal Jesus**. Go forth to announce to the world - Christ, our hope, has risen, Alleluia!



### **Faster Message**

I've been thinking what life would be like without Easter. You might say it would mean one less holiday and not much more. In fact, despite the odd escapist pleasure, life would be one long and dark Calvary. That's the kind of living death many people know, a life without Easter. In the end, that's the definition of paganism—keeping in mind that pagans aren't bad people, just people who find real hope and hence real life difficult or impossible. As St Paul says of us Christians, we are the most pathetic people of all if Jesus isn't risen from the dead. But once he does rise and once we believe he rises, then everything changes—not suddenly or magically but slowly and deep down where the victory of Easter is unstoppable. We have the peace of those who know how the story ends. On the way to that ending, there are and will be agonies of every kind, as we see daily around the world, and less frequently perhaps in our own life. But the agony of Calvary will give way to the joy of Easter. All the blood and tears of the world, gathered up in the Cross, will give birth to the songs of joy which are unique to Easter, music that reaches beyond all our disappointment, disillusionment and depression. The world without Easter would be a tomb. The world with Easter is
