Jn 11:3-7.17.20-27.33-45

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

The sisters Martha and Mary sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come, she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said: 'I am the resurrection and the life.

If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.

Do you believe this?'

'Yes, Lord,' she said, 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.'

Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said,

'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?'

Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.'

Martha said to him, 'Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?'

So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:

'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer.

I knew indeed that you always hear me, but I speak

for the sake of all these who stand round me,

so that they may believe it was you who sent me.'

When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, here! Come out!' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face.

Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, let him go free.'

Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what he did believed in him.

Gariwerd Parish

We've had confirmation now that our parish is to be called Holy Spirit Parish, Gariwerd. Our new email address is gariwerd@ballarat.catholic.org.au Our website is now live. In the coming days we will arrange for the website to better reflect our new parish.

Parish Pipe Organs

This year our parish insurance bill has come in at \$37,000 or nearly \$800 per week. We have 4 churches, 3 presbyteries, 3 parish halls, an OP Shop and 5 flats. All parishes have a similar dilemma. In discussion with the staff from the Diocesan Finance Office parishes are looking at ways to reduce the costs. One of our thoughts is to not insure the pipe organs in Ararat and Stawell. Together they are insured for \$700,000. If they were damaged, by fire as an example, would we actually spend hundreds of thousands to replace them, even if we had the insurance money? Are we insuring for an event we wouldn't actually do, when at present we don't use either organ. (Ararat's organ has been used for Mass three times in my eight years.) We pay for maintenance as well. We have been told to expect a bill of \$10,000 to replace corroded parts in Ararat. How much should we be prepared to spend on an organ we almost never use? If we fix the corroded parts we will have spent \$7,000 for each time we've played the organ in my time here. What if we didn't have a pipe organ in Ararat? We're more likely to use the Stawell organ so for now there is a stronger argument to keep that one. These are the questions we have. What do you think? More to come. Fr Andrew
