#### A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Thus says the Lord of hosts to Shebna, the master of the palace: I dismiss you from your office, I remove you from your post, and the same day I call on my servant Eliakim son of Hilkiah. I invest him with your robe, gird him with your sash, entrust him with your authority; and he shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and to the House of Judah. I place the key of the House of David on his shoulder; should he open, no one shall close, should he close, no one shall open. I drive him like a peg into a firm place; he will become a throne of glory for his father's house.

#### Matthew 16:13-20


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven." 
### Mary in Art at St Mary's

#### Lectionary Art and Reflection by Jenny Close Reflection by Artist

Jesus asked 'but who do you say that I am?' and Peter replied 'you are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.' His reply has three distinct ideas in it: Messiah, the Son of God and the living God. The first is the role that Jesus plays in salvation history, the second is his nature as a person of the Trinity and the third is about the nature of God who is the source of life and active in the life of the world. Peter used words weighty with theology, but I suspect his faith more than his understanding was being expressed here. In any case, his reply is life-affirming theology. That God became human, shows the intimate relationship between God and creation. Integral to that relationship is God's willingness to be recognised in creation, especially in the person of Jesus.



#### REFLECTION FOR YOUNG PEOPLE – by Lisa-Marie Calderone-Stewart

Keys are a symbol of trust and authority, along with responsibility. When have you been given keys? Do you have a key to your family's house? your family's car? your place of work? a room at school? What responsibility comes with being entrusted with a key? Have you ever locked your keys in a car? Have you ever locked yourself out of the house? If so, how did it happen? How did you feel? What did you do? A rock is a symbol of solidness and strength. Rocks are hard to break, but they can break other things easily. Why is a rock a good symbol for faith? How would you describe your own faith? Is it as strong as a rock? Or is it more like a soft, weak substance, such as mashed potatoes, shaving cream, or a dried-out, crumbling leaf? Peter isn't perfect. Remember, before Jesus is crucified, Peter denies him three times, just as Jesus predicted he would. Yet Jesus trusts him to be the leader of his disciples. Why would Jesus trust Peter to be the leader of his disciples? If being perfect is not a condition for having faith, what are the qualities that mark a strong faith?
