Making Connections: Be aware of your human connections with others this week. Look around for opportunities to extend a life-giving touch to others. Who are the people in our communities, in our streets, who are the 'untouchables'? What are some of the ways in which welcome and healing can be extended to them?

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. Jairus, as an official of the synagogue, belonged to one of the groups who were traditionally deeply suspicious and disapproving of Jesus. Here however, Jairus' faith is contrasted with the lack of faith of the onlookers who simply laugh at Jesus. His faith is rewarded. For Jesus to lay hands upon a young woman of twelve years of age (old enough to be betrothed) would have been seen as a scandalous act. Jesus breaks through the restrictions of social norm to bring life.

Sharing the Tradition: Over the history of the Church there have been many women who have played prominent roles in the faith life of the community beginning, of course, with Mary the mother of Jesus as a model of faith. The Church honours many women as saints and the 'Doctors of the Church'. Mary acts in the gospels as a model of faith and discipleship.

Living the Word: Pray for all the women who have leadership roles within your local Church community and in the Church more broadly. Pray for the women that they may become models of faith and discipleship and lead others to know and love Jesus.

Daily Prayer: O God, in the paschal mystery of Christ, who became poor for our sake and obedient even unto death on a cross, you have chosen to enrich us with every good gift and to give us a share in Christ's exalted life. Let us fear neither the cost of discipleship not the inevitability of sharing in the cross but gladly announce to all our brothers and sisters the good news of life healed, restored and renewed

Marriage Tip: Are you a perfectionist? It's natural to want to do a good job but don't let the perfect be the enemy of the good. Don't take yourself too seriously. **Vocational View:** Life can remind us of life eternal; death can remind us of death eternal. Each day we must choose to live or die, physically or spiritually. What we do daily either builds us up or tears us down. Pray for the proclaimers of life!
