Making Connections: What must you do to do the works that God wants? Make time each day this week to reflect on the real nourishment you yearn for. What sustains your life? Did vou Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. The word 'Rabbi' in Hebrew

literally means 'my great one'. At the time of Jesus it referred to masters or teachers who had a following of disciples who learned from them.

Exploring the Word: When Jesus will be lifted up again and exalted on the cross—the pivotal moment of John's Gospel. This self-gift of the Son is the food which will endure to eternal life. The people are being directed beyond their immediate needs to something which will satisfy a much deeper and more fundamental need. Belief in Jesus will provide the nourishment for that deep need. What feeds your inner yearning?

Sharing the Tradition: Moses was one of the great figures of the Hebrew Scriptures. He was God's instrument in freeing the people of Israel from slavery and it was Moses that God gave his Law on Mount Sinai. The Church understands the Hebrew Scriptures as pointing towards the salvation offered by Christ.

Living the Word: What feeds our bodies is transitory; what feeds our souls is that which is our real sustenance. Pray for each other in your search for 'the food that endures to eternal life'.

Daily Prayer: O God, whose gift to our ancestors was manna in the wilderness, we believe in the One whom you have sent, on whom you have set your seal. Nourish us on the bread of Christ's teaching, clothe us in your likeness. May we live a life worthy of our calling and bear witness in true holiness.

Marriage Tip: "In sickness and in health..." Whether it's chronic mental or physical illnesses, seasonal colds and flus, or getting up in years, pain and sickness will happen in married life. In all this, be thankful that you have a spouse to love. even when it hurts.



Vocational View: "I am the Bread of Life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst." 'Lord, send us priests after your own heart to give us the Food of everlasting life - Your very Self in the Eucharist.' Consider a call to the priesthood of Jesus Christ.

We stand for the proclamation of the Gospel, which recounts the words and **deeds of the Lord**. The bishops have chosen standing as the posture to be observed for the reception of Communion.

Eucharist Preparation Week Three - Jesus Present

In celebrating Sunday Eucharist, commonly called the Mass, Catholics gather as a faith community to celebrate God's life giving presence in our world and especially the presence of Jesus Christ. An important role of this gathering is to meet Jesus who speaks to us in the Scriptures by listening to the Word of God proclaimed in the readings. We know this as the Liturgy of the Word—the first part of the Mass. The second part of the Mass is the Liturgy of the Eucharist. As Catholics we are called to be present and participate at the Sunday Eucharist—so that we can be nourished by the Word of God and the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. In the session we will focus on the Liturgy of the Word. Having listened to the Word of God at Mass, our task is to take the message of these Readings with us in our thoughts and actions during the week ahead.

When celebrating the Eucharist (Mass), we believe that Christ is present in:

- The community that gathers;
- The Word that is proclaimed;
- The consecrated bread and wine:
- The priest who presides.

At the Eucharist (Mass), we participate in the mystery that brings Jesus Christ present to us, when the priest invokes the Holy Spirit and says and does what Jesus did at the Last Supper. Catholics believe that the bread and wine brought forward at the Procession of Gifts becomes 'consecrated' (made sacred) and becomes the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood. We then receive and are nourished by Christ's presence under the sign of the consecrated bread and wine. We reply 'Amen' in a joyful and expressive affirmation of our belief in this mystery.

As we share the Eucharist with children, we want them to sense the great love Jesus has for all people, his great desire to be with us always and his challenge for us to live as he did. with love.
