FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY: This ancient celebration proclaims Israel's Messiah being also the Saviour of the entire world. The wise men are led to Jesus by a divinely inspired combination of natural wisdom and biblical prophecy. Their own gifts, the wisdom of their people and their scientific investigations (astronomy) have impelled their quest. They have seen in their eastern homeland a "star" that according to biblical prophecy (Numbers 24:17) signaled the birth of a king who will have universal significance. They have followed this star on their journey and it has brought them to Jerusalem. To locate more precisely the One whose birth it announces, they also need to consult the scribal wisdom of Israel. The chief priests and scribes tell them of the prophecy of Micah that points them to David's city, Bethlehem.

Foreshadowing the later adherence of multitudes of Gentile believers to the faith, the wise men discover the child with his mother Mary and pay homage to him as their ruler. They place before him the gifts of their culture that also complete the biblical picture of the nations of the world bringing their wealth to Jerusalem in exchange for the spiritual riches they will receive from the Jewish Saviour.

Their journey is one of faith and risk. Their coming causes "disturbance" in Jerusalem. The treacherous figure of Herod looms over all, foreshadowing Jesus' final days, but even he cannot impede the riches of God's salvation promised to all, Jew and Gentile, rich and poor, slave and free. We walk in the footsteps of those who visited Jesus, sharing their wisdom, their longing, their faith, and the joy of their discovery. *Fr Brendan Byrne SJ*
