

ALTAR RELICS

Most Catholic churches have relics set into the underside of the altar. It is believed that this tradition originated with the Eucharistic celebrations in the catacombs during the period of persecution in Rome. Later development saw the altars erected over the tombs of saints, or more simply, the relics of the saints were placed beneath the altar. The symbolism of this use of relics emphasizes that it is the Eucharist itself from which the saints derived their holiness. At one time the relics were set into the altar stone.
