His name became a byword for wisdom and shrewd judging, yet he did not always act rightly, nor live up to the love of God's Law sung of in the psalm. During his reign were sown the seeds that led to the division of Israel from Judah, yet it is looked upon as Israel's golden age of prosperity and peace.
