Making Connections: The journey of the disciples to Emmaus recalls our own journey from doubt to faith. Informed by the Scriptures and nourished by the Eucharist, the disciples know that Jesus walks with them.

Did you Know: This gospel text reflects the structure of the Mass: Jesus first opened the Scriptures (the Liturgy of the Word) and then broke bread (the Liturgy of the Eucharis).

Marriage Tip: Where did all the flowers and magic go? Infatuation may get a couple together but eventually fades and romance alone will not keep you together over the long haul. Common values, commitment to each other, and shared experiences are the glue.

Daily Praver: As we hear the word that brings salvation, make our hearts burn within us. In the breaking of the bread, open our eyes to recognize the One whose feast it is. Through the presence of every friend and stranger, reveal to us the face of Christ who had first to suffer but who has entered now into glory.

A Vocation View: We can feel the Lord's call at the strangest places and times. The call can haunt us and pursue us until we say, "Lord, what will you have me do?"



Bishop Paul Bird's Homily at the Chrism Mass - Ballarat Cathedral, April 10 2017

(Excerpt from Homily)

Our celebration this evening touches on those times when we feel weary or stressed, times when we feel weak and fragile, times when we are in need of soothing anointing to bring us healing. We're celebrating the Mass of the Oils. We bless the Oil of Baptism, and the Oil of Chrism, and the Oil of the Sick. Each of these oils touches on our frailty. When we are anointed with the Oil of Baptism, we pray in our weakness that we might be made strong to meet the challenges of living as a Christian. When we are anointed with the Chrism, we are given new strength to be priests and prophets and kings. We are given a share in the priesthood of Christ to offer praise to our heavenly Father. We are given a share in Christ's spirit of prophecy to be able to speak the truth in love. We are given a share in Christ's kingship, that we might be true Christian leaders, giving ourselves in serving others. When we are anointed with the Oil of the Sick, we pray that we might be healed in body and mind and spirit.

In our Mass this evening, we will pray for the priests of our diocese. We will also pray for the laity and religious. We will pray for one another because we are all in need of prayerful support. We know our weakness, but we also know that we have great sources of strength. In our times of frailty, may we turn to Christ in prayer. We remember his encouraging words: "Come to me, all you who labour and are heavy burdened, and I will give you rest." May we also be a support to one another. Like Christ, we have been anointed to bring good news to the poor and bind up hearts that are broken. In times of need, may we strengthen one another and bless one another with the oil
