Pope Francis: Abandoning migrants at sea is an 'attack on life'. Pope Francis said "life is a gift" and urged more reflection on how people are treated throughout all stages of **life**. The degree of progress of a civilisation is measured precisely by its capacity to care for life, especially in its most fragile phases. He said "When we speak of humanity, let us never forget the attacks on the sacredness of human life. The plague of abortion is an attack on life. Allowing our brothers and sisters to die in boats in the Strait of Sicily is an attack on life. Death at the workplace, because minimum safety conditions are not respected, is an attack on life. Death because of malnutrition is an attack on life. Terrorism, war, violence, euthanasia as well, is an attack on life. To love life is to care always for others, to want their good, to cultivate and respect their transcendent dignity" he said.
