Making Connections: Be attentive this week to how the seed of God's word and love is growing within you. Foster this growth in as many ways as you can and try to plant the seeds of faith in the hearts of others.

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. The term 'kingdom of God' refers to a time when God's will would be done on Earth. Matthew uses the term 'kingdom of heaven' as a way of avoiding the use of the sacred name of God.

Sharing the Tradition: 'This Kingdom shines out before men in the world, in the works and in the presence of Christ.' To welcome Jesus' word is to welcome 'the Kingdom itself'. The seed and beginning of the Kingdom are the 'little flock' of those whom Jesus came to gather around him, the flock whose shepherd he is...To those who he thus gathered around him, he taught a 'new way of acting' and a prayer of their own.' (CCC §763, §764)

Exploring the Word: The kingdom or reign of God refers to the time when God's will is done.

Living the Word: The mystery of the kingdom of God is at the heart of this reading. Humans cannot understand how it will grow and spread, but, once planted, it will prosper as the seed does, taking root and growing to fullness. What begins as a tiny seed like the mustard seed, will grow into something much larger and offer shelter for all.

Daily Prayer: From your bountiful hand, O God, you have sown generously in our hearts the seed of your truth and your grace. May we welcome with humility and confidence what you sow in the soil of our lives and cultivate its growth with the patience the gospel teaches, trusting completely and knowing full well that peace and justice increase in this world every time your word bears fruit in our lives.

Marriage Tip: Children are a great gift, and as desired as children usually are in a marriage, raising them can also bring stress. Don't let arguments over child discipline sap your energy and alienate you from each other. Take a break. Build a list of a few reliable sitters.

Vocational View: A vocation is like a mustard seed which, **when planted** in the heart, is like a childhood dream. Yet once we begin to believe that God is calling us, we begin to blossom into the dream of a lifetime. People will want to live in the shade of our loving response.



Former Passionist Provincial, Fr Peter McGrath CP passed away peacefully on the morning of March 3rd after a long and serious illness. He will be missed—he was a great Passionist.

Peter McGrath was 58 years professed and 53 years ordained. He is best known as the Founder and leader of the Passionist Family Group Movement. Since its establishment in 1972, the Movement has grown considerably and now there are Family Groups in Australia, New Zealand, England and Ireland, thanks largely to Fr Peter who until his illness, worked tirelessly promoting the Movement.
