QUEEN REMEMBERED FOR HER SERVICE AND STRONG CHRISTIAN FAITH

- Australian Catholic leaders have expressed their condolences following the death of Queen Elizabeth II, acknowledging her strong Christian faith and 70-year reign.
- Australian Catholic Bishops conference president Archbishop Timothy Costelloe led tributes to the late Queen on Friday, after the monarch died on Thursday (local time) in Balmoral, Scotland.
- "The death of Queen Elizabeth II, after a long reign marked by extraordinary constancy, fidelity, courage and service, will bring great sadness to many people in Australia, including members of the Catholic
- community," Archbishop Costelloe said. "As the Queen enters into the great mystery of eternal life with
 the Lord, we will pray for the repose of her soul and for the support and comfort of her family, her nation
- and the wider community of the Commonwealth. "Queen Elizabeth was never reticent about
 - acknowledging her Christian faith. Her annual Christmas message invariably focused on Jesus Christ as a
- model of humble and generous service. It was a model she strived to emulate throughout her long life.
 May she rest in peace."
- September 9, 2022- Catholic Religious Australia president Fr Peter Jones OSA said CRA echoed "Pope
 Francis' tribute to the Queen's steadfast witness of faith in Jesus Christ".
- "She was a wonderful human being as well as profoundly committed servant of her people and conscientious faith leader," Fr Jones added. CRA national executive director Anne Walker said the Queen was "a connector of people and she remained committed to her values, to her trust in God and to a life of service". Catholic Health Australia chair John Watkins said Queen Elizabeth would be "remembered for a lifetime of dedication and service to her country, and to the Commonwealth. She was a person of deep faith who regularly cited her devotion to Jesus Christ and the example he set."
