Ukraine's chief Catholic leader said Russia's new strategy in its war against its neighbour is "the destruction of our civilian population".

In an address marking the 112th week of the full-scale Russian invasion, Major Archbishop Sviatoslav Shevchuk of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church said Russia uses "diabolical tactics — to destroy not only human life, but also those who serve it." "Our girls and boys at the front are heroically defending their land and managed not only to stabilise the front, but also to stop the advance of the Russian army," he said. "That's why today we want to especially thank our rescuers, doctors, paramedics – everyone who continues to fulfill his professional duty." "We also thank our energy workers, who are tirelessly eliminating the consequences of Russian attacks on civilian infrastructure. Thanks to the heroism of our military personnel, professionalism and heroic service to our people, doctors and all other representatives of the services of our cities and villages, today we can say: Ukraine stands, Ukraine fights, Ukraine prays.

Australia's Catholic bishops have acknowledged the release of the document, *Dignitas Infinita*, and commended it for study and reflection.

The document released by the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith on Monday was five years in the making.

Prefect for the Dicastery of the Doctrine of the Faith, Cardinal Victor Manuel Fernandez, described the document as offering "some points for reflection that can help us maintain an awareness of human dignity amid the complex historical moment in which we are living".

"This is so that we may not lose our way and open ourselves up to more wounds and profound sufferings amid the numerous concerns and anxieties of our time,"

The document states that "every human person possesses an infinite dignity, inalienably grounded in his or her very being, which prevails in and beyond every circumstance, state, or situation the person may ever encounter".

It talks of four types of dignity (ontological, moral, social and existential) the most important of which is ontological – that is the dignity which belongs to the person "simply because he or she exists and is willed, created, and loved by God … (it) is indelible and remains valid beyond any circumstances in which the person may find themselves".

It identifies 13 "grave violations" of human dignity: poverty; war; the mistreatment of migrants; human trafficking; sexual abuse; violence against women; abortion; surrogacy; euthanasia and assisted suicide; the marginalisation of people with disabilities; gender theory; sex change; and digital violence.
