We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection, until vou come again.

We celebrate three great feasts in January: The Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord, and the Conversion of St. Paul. Inherent in all of these is the idea that we first undergo a change in our lives and then we live out that change. From the Magi who left their homeland to find the Christ child to Paul, who changed from persecuting Christians to leading them, to Jesus himself who, although sinless, submitted to baptism to

show us the way. The feasts of January are intended to lead us into a deeper



Baptism of the Lord (January 11) We recall Jesus baptism in the river Jordan by John the Baptist on this feast (Matthew 3: 13-17). Although Jesus was sinless, he submitted to baptism as an example to us. We must first be converted to a new life and leave behind our sinful

nature before we can truly become his disciples. As the Catechism says, through Baptism the Christian is sacramentally assimilated to Jesus, who in his own baptism anticipates his death and resurrection. (CCC 537).

If you have pictures from a family baptism, show them and talk about the events of the day.
