Dear friends,

Jesus uses parables which are very special kinds of stories describing real life situations. Every parable therefore invites the listener to reflect on the situation described in the story. Hence in the parable of the sower, Jesus invites us to look into our inner life and see how we accept the seed, which is God's word we receive each day of our witnessing life and how much fruit we produce. If our hearts are open and receptive to the word of God and if we treasure it in our heart then the transformation takes place. If we are willing to do everything required according to his word, then our life will bear much fruit: namely fruits of love, mercy and goodness.

The seed grows where there is openness to the word of God in faith, trust in its power to motivate us and a readiness to face all the obstacles which ever may come on our way when we live according to our call of discipleship. Jesus teaches us that the establishment of God's rule on earth does not come automatically. His teaching will not instantly transform the hearts of every listener. Unless they trust in the power of God and express the willingness to make sacrifices to transform their hearts to witness the word of God. Let us pray for the power of the Holy Spirit to accept the world of God with open heart and act accordingly and bear much fruit in our day-to-day life. -Neville

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Is 55:10-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The rain makes the earth fruitful.

Thus says the Lord: 'As the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.'
The word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God.**

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 64:10-14. R. Lk 8:8

(R.) The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest.

- 1. You care for the earth, give it water, you fill it with riches. Your river in heaven brims over to provide its grain. (R.)
- 2. And thus you provide for the earth; you drench its furrows, you level it, soften it with showers, you bless its growth. (R.)
- 3. You crown the year with your goodness. Abundance flows in your steps, in the pastures of the wilderness it flows. (R.)
- 4. The hills are girded with joy, the meadows covered with flocks, the valleys are decked with wheat. They shout for joy, yes, they sing. (R.)

Second Reading: Rom 8:18-23

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

All creation is waiting for the revelation of the children of God.

I think that what we suffer in this life can never be compared to the glory, as yet unrevealed, which is waiting for us. The whole creation is eagerly waiting for God to reveal his sons. It was not for any fault on the part of creation that it was made unable to attain its purpose, it was made so by God; but creation still retains the hope of being freed, like us, from its slavery to decadence, to enjoy the same

freedom and glory as the children of God. From the beginning till now the entire creation, as we know, has been groaning in one great act of giving birth; and not only creation, but all of us who possess the first-fruits of the Spirit, we too groan inwardly as we wait for our bodies to be set free.

The word of the Lord. All: Thanks be to God.

Gospel Acclamation: (Please stand for the Gospel Acclamation)

Alleluia, alleluia! The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower;

all who come to him will live for ever. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mt 13:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

A sower went out to sow.

Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables.

He said, 'Imagine a sower going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Others fell on rich soil and produced their crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!'

The Gospel of the Lord. All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Here is Jesus telling another story about nature, in this case about soil good enough to bear a crop. Is he just a keen observer of the farmers of his time? No.

Throughout the Gospels there is a harmony between Jesus and the natural creation of a profound kind.

But St Paul intuited that link at a profound level in the case of the Risen Lord. This led him to make the most amazing claim that:

'The creation itself would be set free from its slavery to decay in order to share the freedom associated with the glory of the children of God.'

We, and the whole cosmos, share the legacy of a common destiny brought about by the powerful victory of Christ over the final instance of decay, destruction and every type of death.

We could pause a moment to pray with the angels as we do at every Mass:

'Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.'
