

Dear Friends, In today's gospel we see that Jesus is telling us which is important in his discipleship through his story. Let us ask ourselves: Is there anything more important than serving the Lord? The gospel says: There is none other than following the Lord. Mary in the gospel chooses to be with Jesus rather busy herself preparing food with Martha for Jesus and his disciples to eat. The Lord tells Martha that while it is good to prepare food for him, it is better to just be with him. It is, after all, their company that he seeks, not the food that Martha is preparing.

We would have experienced something similar when we visit our friends' places where the family is busy with preparing food for us rather than sitting, having conversation and socializing. Yes we have to eat but the preparing of food is not the most important part of our meeting. As you know we can always order and get the food delivered. The time that we spend with our friends adds fuel to our companionship, rather than preparing food. Sometimes we fail to read the importance in our life. Because, the anxiety of preparing good food takes away the happiness of our company. Through the gospel story Jesus tells us that he wants us in his company. Sometimes the worst competitor of our love for the Lord is our work for the Lord. Take time just to be with the Lord and listen to him before the Blessed Sacrament or listen quietly to his word as you read the Bible in the Spirit. -Neville.

First Reading: (Genesis 18:1-10) *Lord, do not bypass your servant.*

A reading from the book of Genesis

One hot summer afternoon Abraham was sitting by the entrance to his tent near the sacred trees of Mamre, when the Lord appeared to him. Abraham looked up and saw three men standing nearby. He quickly ran to meet them and bowed with his face to the ground. He said, "Please come to my home where I can serve you. I will have some water brought, so you can wash your feet, and then you can rest under the tree. Let me get you some food to give you strength before you leave. I would be honoured to serve you."

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke

The Lord and his disciples were travelling along and came to a village. When they got there, a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. She had a sister named Mary, who sat down in front of the Lord and was listening to what he said. Martha was worried about all that had to be done. Finally, she went to Jesus and said, "Lord, doesn't it bother you that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her to come and help me!"

The Lord answered, "Martha, Martha! You are worried and upset about so many things, but only one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen what is best, and it will not be taken away from her."

The Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Jesus turned the customs and taboos of his society upside down. In this Gospel, against all the rules of segregation, Jesus is alone with women who are *not* his relatives, completely at ease with their hospitality. It is personal relationships, not gender determined relationships, which are important to him.

Further, here is Mary assuming the posture of a student at the feet of a Rabbi (teacher) listening to his teaching. We remember that Jesus had chosen his male disciples in order to teach *them*. Mary chooses *Him* to teach *her!* Maybe it was a counter-cultural step too far for Martha. Is that what she is really 'anxious and troubled' about?

Jesus was willing to upset the social conventions and religious taboos of his day in respect of women. What would be a good contemporary response of the Catholic Church?

The word 'cardinal' means hinge – 'hinge of the door' – an essential part of the structure of the Church which is our home, in which we listen to the words of Jesus Christ. Could the College of Cardinals be supplemented to include women alongside the ordained male prelates? Outstanding women, religious or lay, could head some Vatican departments and take part in the election of the Pope. That would be a strongly symbolic step with repercussions throughout the Church.

We could pause for a moment to pray for the Church to show a greater willingness to sit, like Mary, at the feet of Jesus so that we may hear his words: 'You have chosen the better portion.'
