Dear friends,

On this first day of the New Year, we honour Mary, the mother of God and the mother of the church. For this stage, in our journey of faith and pilgrimage to Jesus, the gospel suggests that we reflect on three reactions to Jesus' coming.

The shepherds' understanding of the message of the Angel made sense, when they see the infant lying in the manger. They understood their message that has been told to them about the child. Their accepting attitude leads them to glorify and praise God. They became the messengers of God's glory. Those who have heard the shepherds are amazed by what has been told to them. Though, we are not told whether they went in a larger or a small group to go to see the child Jesus, but, on our part, we are called to share his good news with others and to praise God.

Mary reflects on everything that happens. She patiently waits for the unfolding of God's plan for her. She accepts things as they are, ponders on them in the silence of her heart. Her attitude allows God to take control of her very life. With love and hope she accepts His promises and follows God's will and God's plan.

As we welcome the New Year, let us take Mary our mother as our model and open ourselves to God's plans. When we do not get what we ask for, let us accept God's will and firmly believing that God loves us and wants only what is best for us. With love and patience let us wait for the unfolding of God's plans like Mary. Even failures must be perceived as blessings.

Pope Francis' Prayer for Peace:

Lord God of peace, hear our prayer!

We have tried so many times and over so many years to resolve our conflicts by our own powers and by the force of our arms. How many moments of hostility and darkness have we experienced; how much blood has been shed; how many lives have been shattered; how many hopes have been buried... But our efforts have been in vain.

Now, Lord, come to our aid! Grant us peace, teach us peace; guide our steps in the way of peace. Open our eyes and our hearts, and give us the courage to say: "Never again war!"; "With war everything is lost". Instil in our hearts the courage to take concrete steps to achieve peace.

Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarrelling into forgiveness. Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam! Amen.

REFLECTION by Diane Bergant CSA

Liturgically, the Octave of Christmas commemorates: the Solemnity of the Mother of God; the day designated for prayers for global peace; and the beginning of the New Year. Though the shepherds gain insight into the presence of God by seeing this holy family, it is Mary who holds all these things in her heart. She is the one who ponders the significance of these mysterious events. Mary becomes for Christians an inspiration of contemplation and reflection. She inspires us to consider deeply the significance of events, lest we go blandly through life without meaning or direction. She inspires us to fidelity to the practices of our faith, practices which are the disciplines of soul that lead the community to a clearer focus on God's presence in human affairs.

The theme of peace appears today on many levels. Its meaning, 'fullness of life', bursts forth in every one of the readings. The ancient prayer or blessing of peace is an appropriate start for the New Year. It resonates well with the angels' wish for people of good will. Peace is also our inheritance in Christ. As adopted children of God, we have been given the freedom to live in a godly manner, calling God our *Abba*. Right relationships in the covenant activity of God are the pathways of peace. The beginning of a New Year is a good time to reach out to others and to pray for God's blessing of peace for each dimension of human encounter.
