

Dear Friends,

The parable of the wheat and the weeds is imbedded in nature and behaviour of the people in Jesus' time. The word 'weeds' refers to a poisonous plant often found in the wheat fields. The enemy who sows weeds may be a jealous neighbour, who struggles and cannot cope with the prosperity of the other people, who waits for the favourable time to seek honour by putting down others. Jesus uses this situation in life to paint what should be the behaviour of the people who belong to the kingdom of God: that is the children of God, governed by the will of God.

Jesus rejects the Jewish notion of 'Chosen People' and opens his circle to all kinds of people, including sinners and outcasts. No group is so perfect that it does not include 'weeds'. We all share the same human nature and that is subjected to jealously, hatred, revenge, and self-glory. But we could overcome these bad human inclinations by the power of God. It might be a lifelong battle to fight against our human tendencies. Hence, God's judgement will indeed expose people's evil deeds.

In the meantime, people live and struggle in this world as wheat and weeds in the field. Therefore, we must watch out that what is evil and what is right in the eyes of God. So let us pray for the wisdom of God so that we may be judged with what is right and wrong. -Neville

The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

One loves someone so much – a child, a parent, a spouse or partner – yet when one tries to pray for that person the words seem only a pale shadow of the intensity of feeling and total love one feels. Stop! Simply put the person or situation before God and say nothing. The Holy Spirit will express our heartfelt prayer for us.

One's heart is breaking with grief for someone close who is very ill or dying. Or one feels a terrible anxiety or anguish. Words don't come easily even though one wants to pray. Stop! Put the person or situation before God and say nothing. The Holy Spirit will express our heartfelt prayer for us.

Perhaps accentuated by the constant messaging of social media, when trying to pray we can get anxious when there is a lull in the noise and no words come. We could pause for a moment to relax and to allow the Spirit to express our plea in a way which could never be put into words.
