Bishop Paul Bird's Christmas Message Christmas is a feast for everyone – the young and the old and all those in between. The gospel account of the first Christmas tells of a heavenly messenger appearing to shepherds and sharing news that was meant for all. "I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ, the Lord". The news was good news of great joy for all the people. It was indeed news of great joy for children and we see later in the gospel story that children gave a lead in welcoming Jesus. So much so that Jesus urged all his followers to become like children in being open to his teaching. Yet the news was meant for people of all ages. People in the middle years might be represented by the shepherds. Those who lived in the fields and kept watch over their flocks by night would have included some in the prime of life – with the health and strength to cope with the rigours of the outdoors and the demands of looking after the flocks. As people celebrate Christmas nowadays, they often make it a feast for family gatherings, an occasion when the young and the old and the in-between spend time together. The little ones can bring their energy and excitement, the parents can share their joy in their children and the grandparents' hearts can rejoice to see their children and grandchildren. All the generations together can celebrate the feast of Christ's birth. Sometimes people also invite others to join their family celebration. It might be an elderly person who lives alone. When people make room for others at the table, Christmas is all the more as it should be - a feast of the Saviour who came to gather together the scattered children of God. May this Christmas continue to bring the blessings that come

with gathering as a family – young and old together. And may the spirit of Christmas stay with us throughout the year. May we come together often, sharing our gifts, from the youngest to the oldest. *Bishop Paul Bird*.

**Christmas Reflection -Sr Veronica Lawson** The readings for the Christmas liturgies vary from celebration to celebration. The child Jesus is identified as Messiah or Christos (the anointed of God) and descendant of Israel's ancestors, Abraham and David. His name is symbolic of the salvation or liberation he will bring for "his people". At this time of Earth's distress, we are conscious of our need to be saved from our "sins" which include our capacity to destroy God's world for selfish gain. Luke tells us that Jesus was born into the world of the Roman Empire during the reign of Caesar Augustus. In his lifetime, Augustus was acclaimed by the people as saviour of the world, son of God, and bringer of peace, albeit by violent means. Luke's communities at the end of the first century would have known the achievements and reputation of Caesar Augustus. These early Christians would have recognised in Luke's story of the birth of Jesus a very deliberate attempt to proclaim Jesus, rather than Caesar Augustus, as the face of God, as saviour of the world, and as bringer of the good news of peace. Luke is a master storyteller. He weaves, from Israel's sacred history and from what he knows about Jesus' origins, a wonderful tapestry of life and hope for the world, a tapestry that unites the heavenly, the human, and the animal world in one great act of praise. The peace of Christ is the deep peace of non-violence and reconciliation. It is the peace that satisfies the longing of our hearts. The Word enfleshed among us, brings home to us the nature of the birth of the child Emmanuel, God-with-us.

#### 1st Reading Isaiah 9:1-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Those who lived in a land of deep darkness on them light has shone. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and righteousness from this time onward and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

# **2nd Reading Titus 2:11-14**The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all, training

us to renounce impiety and worldly passions, and in the present age to live lives that are self-controlled, upright, and godly, while we wait for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ. He it is who gave himself for us that he might redeem us from all iniquity and purify for himself a people of his own who are zealous for good deeds.

#### Gospel Luke 2:1-14

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands, of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!"
